Here at St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, we carry out our mission to accompany and serve others far beyond the parish walls. As a member church of the Prince William County Cooperative Council of Ministries (CCoM), a coalition of Christian churches living the faith through service to those in need, we commit two weeks each year to provide nutritious balanced dinners for the families residing at the Hilda

Barg Homeless Prevention Center in Woodbridge. These dinners consisted of an entree and two sides and were prepared either in our parish kitchen or the homes of our volunteers.

Operating at full capacity, parishioners generously provided meals for the shelter to feed roughly 30 adults which would also be enough food to feed the children residing at the shelter!
