Description of the Simchas Torah Festivities

Simchas Torah Night:

 After the evening service, on Simchas Torah Evening, all the Torah scrolls are removed from the ark, followed by dancing with the Torah. We read the beginning of the final Parsha of the Torah. This is the only time during the year that the Torah is read at night.

Simchas Torah Day:

- During the morning service, all the Torahs are again taken from the ark and the joyous dancing with the Torah is repeated.
- The final Parsha (weekly portion) of the Torah is read. It is customary that every man present in the synagogue receives an Aliyah be called to the Torah on Simchas Torah. The final Parsha is therefore read over and over until everyone has had an Aliyah. We will have several Torah readings take place simultaneously to achieve this efficiently.
- o At the end of the Torah reading, there are three special aliyot for Simchas Torah:

Kol ha-Ne'arim (All the Children): The children in the synagogue come to the bimah and stand beneath an outstretched tallis. Since children under the age of 13 do not officially receive aliyos, one adult recites the blessings over the Torah with them. After the concluding blessing over the Torah, the congregation then recites the blessing for the children, HaMalach Ha'Goel This is the part of the blessing that Jacob gave to Joseph's sons, Ephraim and Menashe.

The Chosson Torah Aliyah (The Bridegroom of the Torah): This is the final Aliyah of the Torah. This Aliyah is a great honor and is purchased and gifted to the Rabbi. After the Aliyah, the congregation recites: *Chazak, chazak, v'nis'chazaik*. Be strong, be strong and we will be strengthened.

Chosson Bereishis (The Bridegroom of the beginning of the Torah): This Aliyah restarts the Torah, as we begin Bereishis again.
