Annual Events and Traditions

Walk Day

⇒ Friday, Sept. 20, 2019

Walk Day is an annual tradition. It is traditionally held the Friday of Homecoming Weekend.

There are no classes on Walk Day. Students will come to school at regular time and will be dismissed after they have completed the Walk. Therefore, arrangements must be made for early pick-up.



Student Retreats

⇒ Freshman Day of Renewal, Friday, October 25

Each year students will attend a retreat as part of their Theology curriculum. The retreat for the freshman is called "Freshman Day of Renewal." It will be a one-day retreat supported by the Theology department and senior peer ministers. Students will stay on campus for the day.



Mardi Gras

⇒ Sunday, Feb. 16, 2020

The annual Mardi Gras Pageant and Ball is the most prestigious student event of the year. It honors 40 senior students who have given their time and talents in service to the school and community throughout their high school experience. During the evening ceremonies, a Mardi Gras King and Queen are crowned. The King, Queen and Court then preside over a formal dance open to all McNicholas students.

The Senior Court consists of the top 20 young men and top 20 young women who have actively participated in school events and organizations. Membership on the Court is a result of four years of compiled voting from students and faculty. The top four sophomore and junior young men and women constitute the honor guard.

The Sisters of St. Joseph, who founded McNicholas High School, brought the Mardi Gras tradition from New Orleans to the school in 1952.

This is a formal evening. Attire for students not on court is suit and tie for men, and formal dresses for ladies. A white dress is reserved only for the Mardi Gras queen, so when choosing a dress, do not choose white.

Families of the Mardi Gras court are invited to attend.

Re-Registration

⇒ January-February

In January, you will receive a re-registration packet in the mail. This will contain information for the upcoming year tuition and any financial aid awards. At the time of registration, you must pay the registration fee and deposit to secure your spot. This is non-refundable as we use your registration numbers to determine staffing needs, number of classes, etc. There will be a late fee imposed for families who do not register on time.


McNick at Night

⇒ Saturday, March 14, 2020

Parent Involvement

⇒ Parent Teacher Student Association (PTSA)

PTSA meets monthly and plans events for students and supports the faculty.

⇒ Athletic Boosters

⇒ Theatre & Band Boosters

Each group has their own Boosters organization. Meets regularly to support their programs.

⇒ Rocket Shop

The Rocket Shop falls under PTSA, but a large group of volunteers are needed to staff the Rocket Shop throughout the school year.

⇒ Admissions Ambassador

The Office of Admissions and Enrollment is always in need of enthusiastic parents to help spread the word about McNicholas as a premier Catholic co-educational high school.

⇒ Rocket Nation

New in 2018, this is made up of an enthusiastic group of financial supporters dedicated to providing tuition assistance to current and future Rocket Nation members. Membership is \$100 annually.

- ⇒ Make new friends. Everyone will be coming from many different schools. Hang on to the old friendships, but make new ones too! Remember, we are ALL Rockets!
