Each of us builds a temple of morality using the same tools symbolically. Each tool is a virtue or tenet that we apply in our daily lives. Each day is a block of stone carefully sculpted and precisely placed.

In the Entered Apprentice degree we placed ourselves as the North East cornerstone of our buildings. And everyday we add another ashlar. It is usually somewhere between rough and perfect. It is in its proper position and cannot be moved. Just as yesterday cannot be moved to tomorrow or the day before,

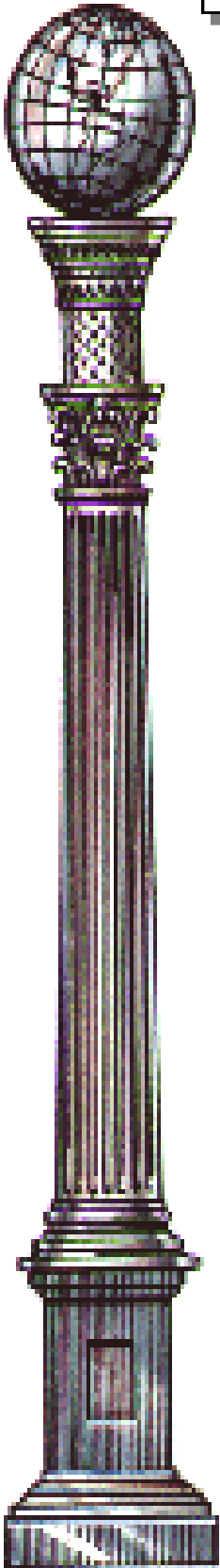

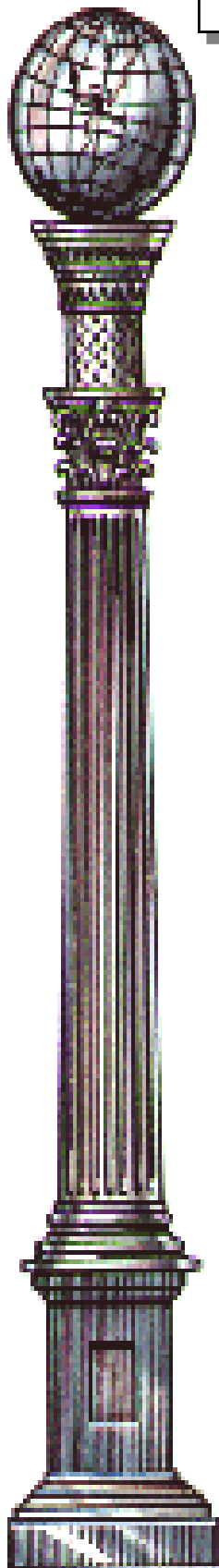

To Practice Masonic values in our daily lives as a Lodge.

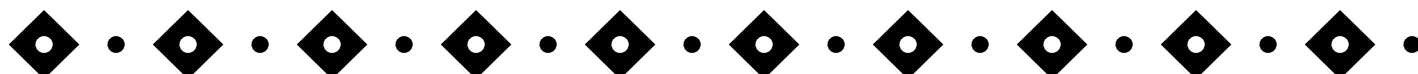

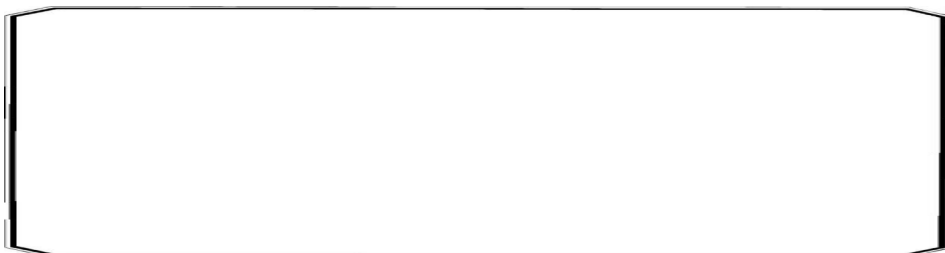

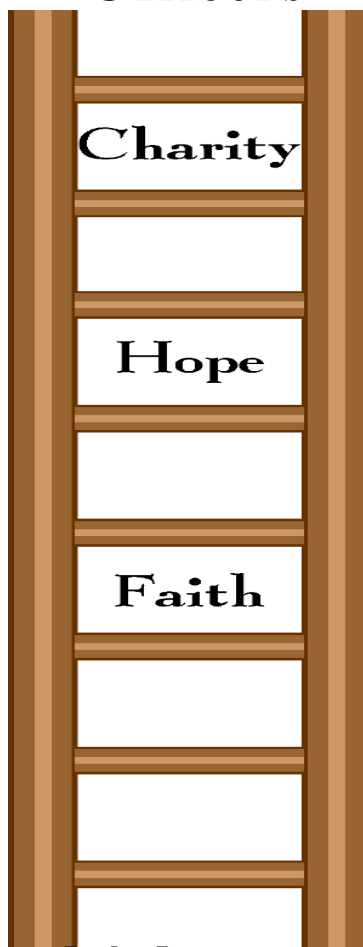
