From the East ...

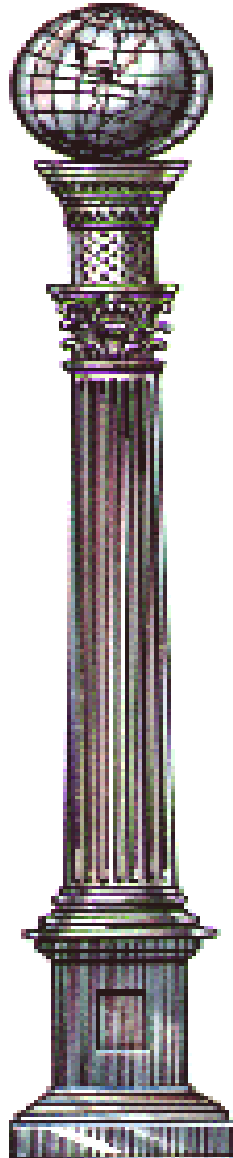
Greetings Brothers,

Starting with the launch of 2019, we implemented a new concept for our lodge: the idea of First Monday. 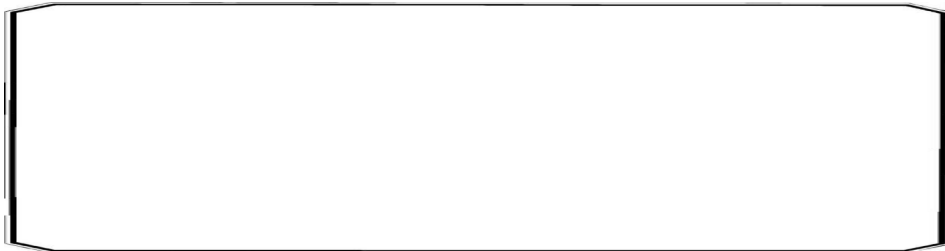

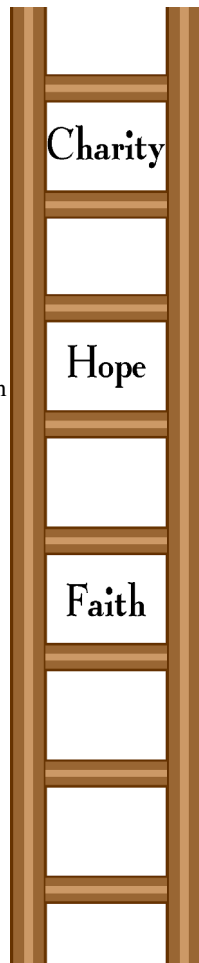
