
From the East ...

But behind the scenes, we've been busy. Our incredible Senior Warden, W.: B.: St. Laurent, has enabled us to continue to meet, albeit informally, from our homes using Zoom. These meetings have demonstrated one thing very clearly: brotherly love is indeed prevailing in ole 192. During our meetings, we have joked and caught up on how life in quarantine is affecting us all. But in addition, we have also reported on our Brothers who cannot join us and who might be in need of assistance during this time. This dedication we have for each other touches me dearly and makes me proud to be a Freemason.

During this pandemic, I have taken some time to reflect on how Masons have weathered similar outbreaks in the past. I found a wonderful article online at The Mountain Xpress about the actions of Masons in one of my favorite mountain towns: Asheville, North Carolina. During the Flu Pandemic of 2018, about 20% of the population of Asheville was infected with influenza. The Red Cross wrote, "More Asheville people are dying of Influenza at home than are dying from all causes on the battlefields of France."



In response, the Asheville Masons opened up their Temple and made it available to the Red Cross. The Masonic leadership wrote in The Asheville Citizen, "Your directing officers ask that, if you have no already done so, you will at once begin your co-operation with the Red Cross Influenza Committee. The Masonic Temple conveniences have been placed at the disposal of the committee, and an Emergency Kitchen is busy preparing nourishing food for the needy." Later, as the Asheville hospital began to overflow with patients, the Masons worked with the Red Cross to convert their Temple into an annex of the local hospital.

The Red Cross would later write in their report, "Words cannot express the gratitude the Red Cross and the people of Asheville owe to the Masonic order in our city. As individuals, the members have been generous with their contributions of money, and the order as a whole has turned out to meet this emergency and has practically given over its entire building and equipment to our use. This debt the city of Asheville should never forget."

Brothers, this is just one example of many. We truly do stand on the shoulders of giants. Our Fraternity has accomplished so many things in the past when society was sick and in need. Let's not let this be a thing of the past! Let's continue the good works that our late brothers have done since time immemorial. Please keep your eyes and ears open for opportunities for us to serve our community during this time. And if you see an opportunity for us to care for our community, please let me know!




