

Brothers,



So, who is this Gulick guy? I'm a 46 year old Native Floridian who grew up in a small town called Lutz. When I lived in Lutz, few people had even heard of it. It was all orange groves and cow pastures. Nowadays, it has built up to the point that I don't even recognize it. But back then, it was the perfect locale for a little kid who loves the outdoors. I spent my free time fishing and driving a go-cart through empty fields. It was marvelous!

I graduated from Gaither High School and went on to the University of South Florida and spent 4 years wandering around campus trying to figure out what to do with my life. In my senior year, I finally decided to pursue my childhood dream of becoming a physician so I graduated from U.S.F. and started over at Stetson University as a premedical student.

A few years later I started my medical education at Nova Southeastern University and then completed a residency in Internal Medicine. I worked a variety of jobs when I finished, the most memorable being my stint with the National Health Service Corps (NHSC). The NHSC is a Federal program that places doctors into locations that are medically underserved, so I spent five-and-a-half years treating the medically underserved in Pinellas County with the Department of Health.



When I finished my time with the Department of Health and NHSC, I took the job I have today: treating veterans at the James A. Haley VA Hospital in Tampa. This job offers me a lot of variety in my practice. When doctors are on leave or retire, I step in to temporarily fill their shoes so there is no delay in the veterans receiving care. One of my favorite parts of the job is that I also have an appointment on the Clinical Faculty at the University of South Florida Morsani College of Medicine and train residents studying Internal Medicine.

On the side, I have a clinical interest in a field called Wilderness Medicine. This involves training and preparing for situations where medical care is hours-to-days away. Currently I give lectures to resident and attending physicians on Wilderness Medicine and, starting June of 2020, I will start training medical professionals in Advanced Wilderness Life Support in the field!

Of all the hats I wear, my favorite hat is that of being a husband to the most amazing woman I have ever met. Jennifer and I are going on 15 years of marriage and she is the most loving and supportive woman a man could ask for. She is a Marketing professional and I fully intend to use her expertise to help our lodge better inject ourselves into our local community for greater visibility and involvement! And when we aren't working, we like to spend time camping, hiking, and traveling around in our RV.

Last but certainly not least, I am a proud Freemason. And brothers, I am excited for our officer line-up for 2020. Together, we are going to make 2020 a wonderful, productive year for Dunedin 192.




