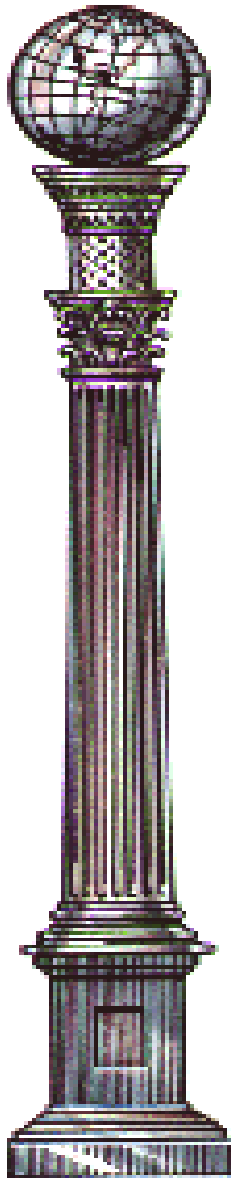

Secretary's Notes

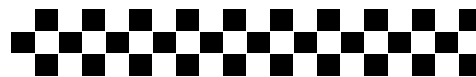
Brothers,

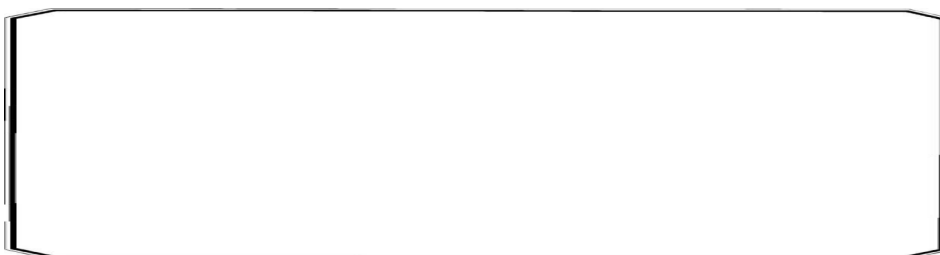

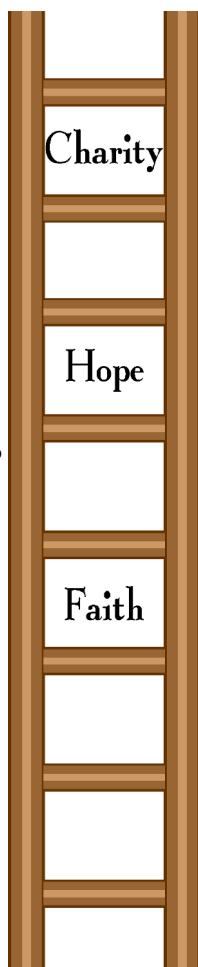
