


From the East ...

Secretary's Notes

Brothers,

We are starting another year off with the same re-occurring problem After two years circumscribe is still having issues that seem to me may never get resolved. You were sent out what was supposed to be permanent plastic dues cards which could be scanned and were supposed to eliminate the need for sending out the paper cards. The problem seems to be that a lot of you didn't receive them or have misplaced them.

Brothers, I can not order replacement plastic cards for you. I have sent several emails to Circumscribe and am no longer getting any response from them. I tried working with the ladies at the Grand Lodge Office and have found that they are having the same issue. They are as frustrated as I am. I have ordered and received paper cards for our membership and will send the 2019 cards to you if you request them.

One of the other issues I see, and I have asked about, is the plastic cards have no date on them. This means if you go to a Lodge that does not have the ability to scan your card to see if you are current with your dues you could be refused entry, especially the out of state and out of country Lodges. The answer I received when I asked this question was, "they are supposed to be accepted". This was not very comforting. I would suggest that all members carry both the paper and plastic cards if you live out of state or plan to travel. I carry both cards and will continue to do so.

When the 2020 dues notices are ordered I plan on ordering the paper cards as well, and, as in the past, I will send you the paper cards when you send in your dues. As for now, I will send them to you by request only.

LODGE NOTES

The Lodge had an emergency with our electrical system. Bro. Giesow tried to turn on the floor lights by the altar using the box behind the Junior Deacons chair and had a lot of sparks come out of the box. It also damaged one of our main electrical panels which is being replaced. In addition the wiring to the altar controlling the three tapers and the lights in the float has melted inside the conduit and the old lines can't be removed so the carpet may have to be cut and a new trench made to run wiring to the altar floor. The work has been completed for the main panel and new wiring for the switches has been run at a cost of \$7500.

However we are waiting to find out the cost to repair the altar floor and repairing the carpet if it needs to be cut and pieced back together. We are working with our Insurance Carrier to see if any damage is covered by our policy. If any Brother can help with the cost of repairs, your donation would be greatly appreciated.




