

ACTION RANGE RULES

It is important that you review some important Range Rules & Procedures. The ability to rent a Training or Action Bay is a privilege extended to members with a current NRA RSO certification.

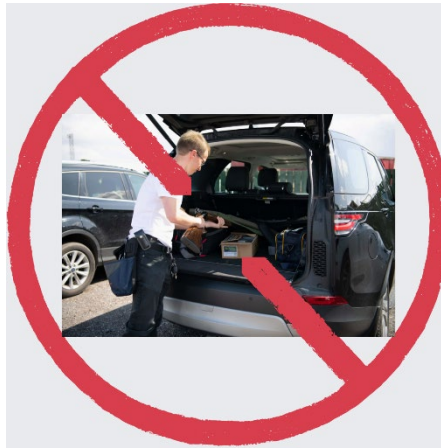
Failure to follow these rules and procedures will result in loss of this privilege.

1. We have additional muzzle restrictions at our range to the *west* and to the *north*. This includes your unloaded guns because from several hundred yards away, nobody can tell if the gun is unloaded. Especially the pilots.
2. Range Etiquette: Nobody wants to see your muzzle on a gun range. DO NOT turn up-range and move with your muzzle sweeping sideways or into the air. Keep your muzzle pointed into a backstop or into the ground. NO MUZZLES POINTED UPWARDS.



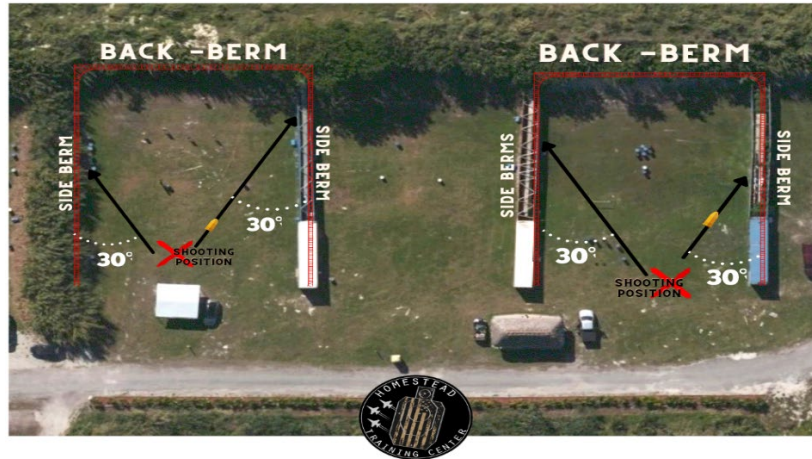
3. Stay inside the side berms of the range you are using. You may not shoot 75 yards at a 25 yard range. Conversely, you may not shoot targets at 25 yards from the overhang on the 500 or 100. Maintain the use good judgement and spatial awareness.
4. Each uncovered bay has a **Safe Area** (in yellow) on one side berm. They are for function testing your gun and bagging it up to leave. **NO AMMO** is to be handled at a **Safe Area**. This yellow safe area also identifies the beginning of the side berm impact area, where your 30-degree rule begins. (see No. 13, 30-degree rule)

5. As with all bays at HTC, ensure you and guests wear appropriate shoes/boots. No open-toe shoes or flip-flops, which can be a tripping hazard.
6. There is to be NO HANDLING OF FIREARMS UNDER COVERED AREAS/TIKI'S OF THE RANGE YOU ARE ON, OR BEYOND THE BERMS OF THE RANGE.
7. **Target Height is Important!** Every shot fired needs to come to final rest inside our range. If your plan is to shoot prone or otherwise near the ground, do not place your head shot targets so the shots go over the backstop. Keep your targets down. Err on the side of caution.
8. Your vehicle is not a clearing barrel. Use a berm & watch your muzzle.



9. Be mindful of others on the range that may see you as an example for their own range conduct. *Set the example* rather than be the problem.
10. We have plate racks steel targets for pistol only. We also have Rifle Rated steel for either type firearm. They are not interchangeable. If you decide to burn a hole in our steel, congratulations. You just bought it. The same goes for our barriers and target stands. See our price list and deposit requirements.
11. You are responsible for your ammunition. Steel core, amor piercing, tracer, green tip, bi-metal, and some frangible, will damage AR550 steel.
12. Bravo, Delta, and Foxtrot through Lima, are rifle/carbine and/or pistol bays. Steel or paper targets. High power rifles are not permitted. For example, a 257 Weatherby will punch a hole through steel at 100 yds. The down-angle of the steel is important for yourself and the safety of others.
13. No steel targets of any kind on Sierra, Tango, Utah and Victor.

14. No personal vehicles are allowed on Sierra, Tango, Utah and Victor.
15. The bays with wood covering the side berms may not be shot at directly by more than a 30 degree angle. See the range office to get a copy of the easy to use template that the range officers use to keep your common sense in check.



16. The only authorized targets are cardboard/paper, range approved steel, polymer and rubber targets.
