



The IECMH Consultation program is grounded in the Pyramid Model. The Pyramid Model is an evidence based, multi-tiered, bottom-up approach. It is important to look at and think about the bottom tiers before you consider the middle and top tiers.

For example, when problem-solving ways to support a child with challenging behavior, ECE staff should reflect on how they respond to a child's communication (i.e., Tier 1- Nurturing and Responsive Relationships) before working with Early Intervention or a Behavior specialist to create a behavior intervention plan (i.e., Tier 3- Intensive Intervention).

Tier 3: Teriary Intervention

- •Intensive Intervention applies to the small number of children who, even when all preventative practices are in place, including targeted supports, still demonstrate social emotional needs and/or challenging behaviors. These children will require additional intensive intervention, typically in the form of Early Intervention (EI) of Intensive Behavior Health Support (IBHS).
- **IECMH Consultants** do not provide Tier 3 services; however, we can assist teachers and families in determining if this level of support is recommended and how to access them.

Tier2: Secondary Prevention

- •Secondary Prevention represents those children who will need extra directions, strategies, and patience to succeed. With the right supports, they will thrive in the classroom.
- IECMH Consultants support teachers in creating targeted, preventative social emotional strategies to prevent problems or challenging behaviors

Tier 1: Universal Promotion

- •Universal Supports states that ALL children need warm, nurturing, and positive relationships in a warm, supportive, and loving environment for healthy social and emotional development. If ECE professionals intentionally create and build positive relationships and a high-quality environment, the social-emotional needs of the majority of the children in their classroom will be met.
