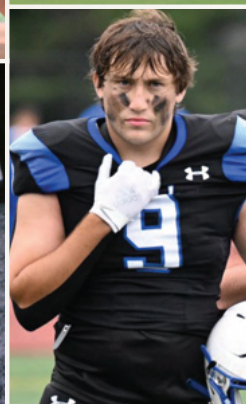

## The Hartford Jewish Sports Hall of Fame

The Hartford Jewish Sports Hall of Fame celebrates the contributions to sports by individuals from the Greater Hartford area. From a large and talented pool of nominees, the selection committee has chosen 16 inductees, encompassing athletes, owners, coaches, and community activists.

For 20 years (1982-2002) the Hall of Fame honored the accomplishments of 86 remarkable sports figures who made a lasting impact on the community. In 1989, the Dr. Morris Cohen Youth Athletic Award for high school athletes was established and has been presented to 43 deserving young athletes. The Jewish Historical Society collects materials on the inductees in its archives, ensuring that a record of their contributions is preserved. The honorees are recognized on a plaque at the Mandell JCC and in an online display on our websites.
