Sharing some good news

In a congregation the size of St. Mark's, a strong staff is critical for ministry in our congregation and in the community. It is also an attractive feature for potential senior pastors considering an interview here.

During the past year there has been significant efforts devoted to the working environment at St. Mark's. I believe these efforts will help attract and keep your future senior pastor and other staff. Here are just some of the things that have been done:



- + The expectations for staff have been made clearer and more realistic.
- + Compensation packages have been reviewed and adjusted to provide more competitive packages. (In addition, two full-time lay staff now have some health benefits.)
- + Pastor Hanson was given a staff position as a visitation pastor after more than thirteen years on short-term contracts.
- + Last June, guidelines were established for communication:
 - Speak directly with the responsible person
 - Set reasonable expectations
 - Before speaking, ask yourself: Is it true, kind, useful?
 - Seek constructive solutions to problems


Now, a year later, I surveyed the staff who are here this June on how well we all follow these guidelines. I asked for their responses on a 1-4 scale, from 1 (Seldom or none of the time) to 4 (Most of the time). The average response was 3.6. This demonstrates a strong commitment to good teamwork.




THANK YOU


CHILD CARE & PRESCHOOL



COUNCIL

Highlights from the April 23rd, May 3rd & May 17th council meetings

Mission Coordinator — Nancy Vogel was appointed as our New Mission Coordinator, which is also a Council position.

Burton Street House — Due to the robust response to our Special Appeal, the team coordinating the Burton Street House project is ready to begin the process of securing a general contractor to put together a phased implementation plan.

Proposal to Affiliate with the LCMC — On April 23rd, representatives from the Call Committee explained their proposal to explore affiliation with the Lutheran Congregations in Mission for Christ as a way to generate more candidates for the position of Senior Pastor. On May 3rd, the Council met with Bishop Roth to explore what this would mean for our relationship with the ELCA. Subsequent discussions resulted in the scheduling of the informational meetings and survey process which was communicated to the congregation through Temple Talks, the Buzz and mailings.

Operation Christmas Child Update: Many of the shoeboxes packed by members of St. Mark's in 2020 went to the country of Ukraine. It appears that the distribution of those shoeboxes to

children may have been delayed (perhaps due to COVID). I have recently received several emails from people in Ukraine who have just received shoeboxes my family and I packed in 2020. I'm assuming many of the shoeboxes YOU packed in 2020 have also recently been given to children living in Ukraine. Your generosity is truly making a difference in the lives of children!

Here's a sampling of the notes my family has received:

My name is Anya. I am 24 years old. I am from Ukraine, I live in Kharkiv. At this time, because of the war, I am in the small town of Koshmanivka, Poltava region. I have two sons Artem and Timofey, they are 4 years old. We received your boxes, the boys were very happy. Many thanks for taking care of us from the other side of the world.

My name is Yuliia. I and my family live in Kharkiv in Ukraine. I have two daughters, Bogdana and Arina, who are 16 and 12 years old. They were very happy to get your gift today! Thank you very much! As you probably know, in our country is war now. Our hometown was constantly bombed, so we had to leave it and move to a quieter place. So it's nice to feel that people you don't know give joy to others. We are very grateful for your support! Pray for our country please! We believe that everything will be fine.
