Provide services including visits to homebound and hospitalized members, premarital and Christian counseling, and health ministries



#### LARGE APPEAL PARTNERSHIPS

#### **DREAM CENTER PEORIA (DCP)**

DCP is a faith-based not-for-profit organization focused on helping families and people living in poverty in the Peoria area. St. Mark's raised more than \$100,000 over two years for projects that supported DCP missions, including a food truck, commercial kitchen, school bus, building roof repairs, hygiene kits and COVID relief funds. Volunteers worked in the DCP Hope store to sort and organize donated clothing and household items. DCP hosted a congregational event — "Rethink Poverty" — that encouraged participants to understand what it might be like to live in a low-income environment.

#### **HABITAT FOR HUMANITY**

Habitat for Humanity is a nonprofit organization that helps families build and improve places to call home. St. Mark's raised more than \$150,000 for three house builds in the Washington community. Our members helped build the homes from start to finish — construction, painting, roofing, siding and more — while supporting the families aligned with the homes.

#### WOMEN OF THE EVANGELICAL LUTHERAN CHURCH IN AMERICA (WELCA)

WELCA is the women's ministry organization of the ELCA. We mobilize women to act boldly on their faith in Jesus Christ through meal ministries, blood drives, monthly food collections and Change for Charity projects.

#### **WASHINGTON HELPS ITS PEOPLE (WHIP)**

WELCA sponsors monthly donations of food and volunteers stock shelves at our local food pantry.

#### WASHINGTON WEEKEND SNACKPAC

Large groups of members along with community volunteers fill backpacks with food for kids in need in the Washington area.

#### **FOOD PANTRY GARDEN**

Members harvest, weed and plant a community garden that provides produce to local food pantries like WHIP and South Side Mission.

#### WASHINGTON CITY CLEAN UP

St. Mark's youth and members help clean, pick up litter and make improvements in the community.

#### **CHURCH MOUSE THRIFT STORE**

Volunteers help sort and organize donated items. Proceeds from the store go to help Lutheran Social Services and Lutheran Hillside Village.

#### **GLOBAL OUTREACH**

#### MIDWEST FOOD BANK

Volunteers help package food for distribution to help fight hunger worldwide.

#### **GUATEMALA MISSION TRIP**

St. Mark's raised money to help with installations of safe, fuel-efficient stoves for impoverished rural communities.

#### **YOUNG LIVES**

This Christian outreach program offers mentoring and bible study to Peoria-area teens. St. Mark's provides Young Lives a safe environment to meet and learn about Jesus.

#### **OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD**

St. Mark's fills more than 500 shoe boxes with gifts and toiletries for children overseas. The church is the local distribution collection center for 11,000+ boxes in the Peoria-area.

#### CHANGE FOR CHARITY

WELCA sponsors a monthly collection for organizations in need locally or globally by having children pass around collection containers during the worship service.

We have a quiet, comfortable room off the sanctuary for parents and baby.



# WE FIND INSPIRATION THROUGH **HISTORY**

History grounds us, reminding us of the strong foundation on which our church is built. In 1875, Pastor Simeon W. Harkey delivered the first sermon at St. Mark's to a congregation of 19 in a rented building. That year, construction began on a new church at the corner of Walnut and Elm. But soon, growth demanded that we expand again.

In 1910, local banker Henry Denhart made a proposal: a donation of land and \$20,000, provided the congregation could raise an additional \$10,000. He also offered to match each dollar raised with a two-dollar donation. The challenge was successful. Ground was broken in April 1911 on our current building, where we've been proud to serve Washington and the surrounding communities for more than a century.





