## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:

For devotions at council, members have been reading and discussing "Canoeing the Mountains." A bestselling book about church leadership in uncertain times. Times such as now for the Church.

The author tells of the epic two-year journey of Meriweather Lewis and William Clark in 1804 to chart the best route to the Pacific Ocean after the Louisiana Purchase. The problem? The Rocky Mountains that were not only uncharted, but unknown to the new country of the United States (all 17 eastern states of them).



Lewis and Clark had been traveling mostly by canoe, but you can't canoe up a mountain. So, they traded their canoes and erroneous maps for horses and Indian guides to venture over the Rockies. But that was not an easy decision because change is always difficult. We humans tend to rely on past successes and solutions. Even when facing completely new challenges.

We, the Church, are sitting at the base of a 3,000-mile stretch of uncharted, dangerous mountains. Our canoe (what we have been travelling in for almost 150 years) isn't going to get us up and over the mountains to where God is calling us. We must adapt. Experiment. Trust. Be willing to fail. Learn. Pray. Try again.

In other words, we must be willing to change at St. Mark's because change, or more aptly transformation, is a given when traveling off the map (what we know, what has worked) into uncharted territory. Transformation is difficult. But then the life God has called us to as a congregation is not an easy one, but a meaningful one; one that God is for us and with us. We just must be willing to trade our canoes for horses and trust even more in the providence of God when in uncharted territory.

## WHAT'S NEW

### ST. MARK'S ELECTRONIC SIGN

Approximately two years ago, the Memorial Team began exploring the possibility of a programmable, digital, full-color electronic sign panel under the current lighted sign on the east side of the church. The purpose of the sign would be to display information regarding church services, special church events, programs, and purposeful messaging. In addition, St. Mark's pre-school and daycare would be able to use it for some of its messaging, such as openings available, etc.

In the City of Washington, South Main Street is the second most traveled street with over six thousand cars a day. This guarantees the sign would receive much visibility from the public.

The Memorial team submitted a motion at the July 10 council meeting to approve up to but not exceed \$25K from a dedicated estate cash gift along with some dedicated Memorial accounts to purchase a sign from Martin Signs located in Metamora. The City of Washington, at its city zoning meeting on August 2, approved the two necessary variances required to install an electronic sign. The church then applied for a sign permit from the city.

The Memorial Team is excited to see the completion of this project. Look for the installation of the sign sometime this fall.



### COOKBOOK




## ST. MARK'S HITS THE BIG TIME!

Our medical equipment loan program is still very active. If anyone needs a wheelchair, crutches, grabbers, shower chairs, tub chairs, bedside commodes or knee scooters please reach out to me. A

survey as to what you feel we need to keep our congregation growing and staying connected is in the making and hopefully will be sent out to all members in the very near future. I have been receiving a lot of calls from our older folks needing help at home caring for their parent or their spouse. The details of care and pay would be between you and the family.

I know it was announced in Church that we had one staff member break out in shingles. If you are concerned about shingles please call your Doctor. Here is some information about shingles,

**Shingles is a painful, usually itchy rash that develops on one side of the face or body. The rash consists of blisters that typically scab over in 7-10 days and fully clear up within 2-4 weeks.**

**Shingles is NOT contagious.** You cannot get shingles from someone else. But you can catch chickenpox from someone with shingles if you have direct contact with fluid from their shingles rash. The risk of spreading the virus is low if the shingle rash is kept covered. If you have the rash on the face/head area and it cannot be covered then you should stay home until the areas are scabbed over. I hope this information helps you understand a little bit about shingles. I can't stress enough that if you have any concerns about shingles, please reach out to your Doctor.
