

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:

Uh-oh

There are times you really, really don't want to hear "uh-oh" being said. From your hair stylist when you are getting your hair cut would be one of those times. From your town's income tax department after they stated you were getting a \$700 refund, but then "uhoh" they failed to see one of your W-2s that you filed. so your refund instantly became an amount due instead. When you have your car being worked on and the mechanic says "uh-oh" and you see a small cloud of dense smoke coming up from under your hood. All three of these "uh-ohs" happened to me on the same morning. Not surprisingly, it wasn't a good



"Uh-oh." It's not in the dictionary. You rarely even see it in writing, but when you hear it... those four little letters have jarring significance.

But it isn't just "uh-oh" that stops you when you hear it. It is also "aha." Neither is it in the dictionary. Nor do you usually see it in writing, but when you hear it... A welcomed "aha" you whisper after having struggled with something in school or work, but then the moment of sudden lucidity. Getting lost when driving only to have somehow miraculously arrived at where you needed to be. "Aha!" Remembering someone's name when bumping into him/her in the store after years (or at least guessing correctly under pressure).

Often, we pray about our "uh-ohs" to God. An unexpected bill; a bad day at school or work. "Uh-oh, God, please help me." That we are good at. Uh-oh prayers are fine, and indeed we are to call upon the Lord when we are hurting, anxious, fearful. (Psalm 34:17-18, Matthew 11:28, Philippians 4:6-7, and et al). But what about aha prayers? "God, help me better understand this in my life. God, speak to me and help me to listen to your still voice. God, what am I to learn from this at this time and place?" Prayers for aha.

Don't be so long with your uh-oh prayers and that you are thereby short with your aha prayers. Yes, you are to call upon Lord for help, but so too for wisdom, understanding, faith. (Psalm 24:45, Proverbs 4:5-7, James 1:5, and et al) Pray to God for more and more "ahas" in your life. This is what life is for: for you to grow in faith, to deepen your trust in God, to experience love as a gift from God. The greatest lessons you learn in life are the lessons you learn about yourself. Uh-oh prayers really won't get you there. They are about right here, right now. Aha prayers are about leaning on God for direction, gaining wisdom, becoming more grounded in faith and hope. They are *long* prayers: prayers about who you are becoming. Uh-oh prayers are *short* prayers. They are about reaction, while aha prayers are about new realizations because of God. So when the unwelcomed "uh-ohs" come pray short, but so too pray long for "ahas."

NEWS

- 1. Burton House A committee was designated to explore the feasibility and cost of renovating the house. Due to its poor overall interior condition and the presence of lead piping and asbestos insulation, they determined the cost to make just the ground floor usable would be \$66,572 and that would be hanging ceilings, laying down flooring, expanding the bathroom ourselves. With us contracting all the work out, it would be between \$83K to \$90K. Given the high cost of renovation (and that only being for part of the space), the committee recommended its demolition - at the cost of \$31,336 - and possibly then expanding that parking lot or creating an attractive, usable green space there. After much discussion, the council recommends the church to demo of the Burton House and make that space serve us and/or the community in a better (and economical) way. The house will be open Sunday before the meeting so anyone interested can view its condition.
- 2. Council Restructuring Council is recommending the church restructure its council by combining and/or eliminating four positions. This would take the number of council positions from thirteen to seven. Term lengths would remain the same. This would also remove the requirement that council members chair a certain committee. Executive council will remain, but it would be reduced in the scope of its responsibility to personnel or any other sensitive matter.

Any member is welcome to discuss with any council member more specifics about one or both recommendations. There will be more information presented in church and in its publications about these things before Nov. 12 for everyone's consideration.

*Note: There will be no regular service on Sunday morning.






TRUNK-OR-TREAT


