From Your Senior Pastor

On Epiphany, January 6, we remember the Wise Men's visit to bring gifts for the baby Jesus. This day marks the end of the Twelve Days of Christmas and the beginning of the Epiphany season, which lasts until Ash Wednesday on March 2.

Epiphany is a major celebration in some cultures. In Puerto Rico, Three Kings Day is celebrated with parties and parades. In New Orleans, people eat King Cake, a pastry in which a figure of the baby Jesus is hidden for someone to find as they are eating.

Here at St. Mark's, **we will hold a special Epiphany worship experience at both services on Sunday, January 9, based on the religious symbolism found in the song "Twelve Days of Christmas".** I think you will find it very interesting and meaningful. You will never sing that song again the same way!

There is a deeper meaning to the season of Epiphany. It is the time when **we celebrate Christ being made known to all people** in every culture and nation. It started with the Wise Men and won't end until everyone has the opportunity to hear the gospel and to know Christ for themselves. It's a time in the church when we remember our calling to do evangelism, mission, and outreach, to share the love of Christ through our words and deeds.

In the Sunday gospel lessons during this season, we will see Christ grow from a child to a man, and then begin his ministry, gather disciples, and teach those disciples to share the good news. **We continue Christ's work through our mission at St. Mark's: to grow in faith and discipleship.**

Is there someone you know who needs to hear or experience the love of Christ? Is there someone you could invite to St. Mark's during this Epiphany season? Half the residents in our country are not members of any congregation. Make it your New Year's resolution to share Christ's love with them. **Let's be Epiphany people, making Christ known to all!**



Summer 2022 Mission Trip – June 12-18, 2022

For our Summer 2022 mission trip, St. Mark's High School Youth will be traveling to Detroit, Michigan to work with Cass Community Social Services, which is a Detroit-based agency with a person centered philosophy, dedicated to providing food, housing, health services, and job programs to the homeless population of Detroit.

- CCSS prepares and serves 700,000 meals annually.
- 300 homeless men, women and children currently stay in one of CCSS' shelters or permanent supportive housing programs.
- CCSS operates two weekly free medical clinics and a day program for 125 adults with developmental disabilities.
- 80 adults are currently employed in the agency's Green Industries which marry jobs with sustainability.

As most of you know we now have a Parish Nurse! I am so happy to be here, I started working here November 15, 2021. My office hours are Monday 10am-1pm. Wednesday 9-2, Fridays 9-4. You may reach me by calling the Church 309-444-4618 or Email parishnurse@stmarkswashington.org

I have met some of you during my time here and am looking forward to meeting more of you as time marches on. Keep an eye out for the blood pressure screening which will be happening once a month on Sunday between services, The first Blood pressure screening took place December 12, the next Blood pressure screening will take place January 16, 2022.

As the parish nurse, I am here to promote whole-person care across the life span using the skills of a professional nurse and provider of spiritual care. The parish nurse does not provide care that requires a physician's order, dispense medications, give injections, do blood tests or other invasive procedures.

The ministry of a parish nurse does not replace home health, hospice, or other community health services. The parish nurse offers support for those needing prayer, emotional support, direction or an explanation and enhances and helps coordinate health care needs.

If at anytime you feel you need help but do not know where to turn you are welcome to call or email me and together, we will figure out what you need and Who you need to contact.

Annual Congregation Meeting — Council discussed several items in preparation for the

PLANNED GIVING

Planned Giving through a Charitable Trust

For some people, establishing a Charitable Trust can provide great opportunities for themselves, their heirs, and for their church. Charitable Trusts work two ways.

Remainder Trusts: With a remainder trust, the donor gifts an asset to the trust (often to avoid capital gains taxes), then the donor receives an income for life, or a period of years from the trust. It is also possible to grant your children or grandchildren a period of time to receive that trust income. Following the prescribed time period, the trust assets are then transferred to the church.

People who don't want their children to inherit a lump sum of money will appreciate this option so that the income is provided to heirs over a period of time.

Lead Trusts: These work opposite of remainder trusts. In a lead trust, the charity receives an income stream from the donated assets for a period of years. Following the term of the agreement the asset transfers back to the original donor or to whoever the donor designates. Both Remainder trusts and Lead trusts require professionals to set them up.
