
over. And yes, you are all part of the Lions family, we need to take care of each other as well as serving our larger community family.

One great resource, the Lions Learning Center, was recently shown to be going offline as of March 31, 2019. This Learning Center contains a wealth of information and suggestions of courses to take based on your status. I thought to help you navigate it while the "iron is hot." On the LCI webpage banner at the top, you click on "Resources for Members." From here, you will see a list on the side for the three areas of membership, service and leadership. Use the magnifying glass in the upper right-hand corner to search for "Lions Learning Center." After this, look for the LLC webpage. If you have not already established an account, you will need to do so by entering your member number. If the Club Secretary or President have set up an account in myLCI, he or she can look up your member number for you if you do not know it. Then browse through the courses until you find one that interests you. You will need to turn off pop-up blockers before you start. Just full disclosure, this can be a frustrating process. When I recently re-accessed the Learning Center it showed that one of the courses I thought I had completed was still "in process." Luckily the staff at LCI responded to my e-mail (elearning@lionsclubs.org) the very next day to let me know the pop-up blocker had prevented me from fully completing the course so they graciously updated the status to complete.</p> <p>I strongly encourage you to try out this resource. You will learn lots of useful information, you can do so at your own pace; and, best of all, it's free.</p>

LCIF NOTES

During the recent MD-4 Convention in Sacramento, a very nice Melvin Jones Breakfast was held. 100% Contributing Member Clubs were recognized and awarded plaques for their 2017 -18 donations. Our District had five clubs honored:

There are only 35 100% Contributing Member Clubs in all of California's 725 clubs. This year's contest is open until June 30. For \$20 per member, your club could join this elite group. All monies donated count toward your club's credits for a Melvin Jones Fellowship.

It is always very special if we are able to award any Melvin Jones Fellowships during our District Convention in April. Is your club interested in presenting one? Maybe it is possible to do one special fundraiser or a pass the hat collection to get your club's credits with LCIF up to \$1,000. Applications sent in the next few weeks should ensure that the plaques would be ready by Convention.

We continue to sell tickets for our own Melvin Jones Raffle for \$25 at each District Meeting. At the November meeting, PDG John Robak was the raffle winner and he will be receiving his Melvin Jones at Convention.

LCIF has launched Campaign 100 ---A Capital Fundraising Campaign to Empower Your Service. A new incentive is that when a District donates at least \$10,000 in a fiscal year, they qualify for a 15% rebate. The District Club Sharing Grant allows clubs to apply to the District for monies for any humanitarian project they do. These rebate monies stay in the District account for 10 years. In past years our District has donated more than \$10,000 many times. This sounds like a win-win situation!

DISTRICT 4-C1 CONVENTION—APRIL 12—14, 2019 IN REDDING, CA

District 4-C1 South Butte Region District Meeting

District Governor Sue Kerr

February 23, 2019

The meeting was called to order at 9:00 a.m. by Region Chair Susan Piaskowski. Seventy-two members and guests representing 21 clubs were in attendance. Protocol was established by PDG Dave Marceau. Cabinet officers and guests were introduced by Region Chair Susan.

The minutes of the Shasta District meeting held on November 17, 2019 were distributed for review. 2nd Vice District Governor Tyler Spencer moved to approve the minutes. The motion was seconded by Ray Penix and approved by the membership. A treasurer's report was presented by District Treasurer Aaron Chatfield. PDG Skip O'Brien moved to accept the report as presented. The motion was seconded by Ray Penix and approved by the members present.

IPDG Marianne Keesee reported that Past Council Chair Mary Ryneerson put on a membership workshop for our District in January. She also spent time with the committee planning a Women's Leadership Workshop which will be held in Redding on May 18th. Mary Ryneerson, Susan Grotrian and Arminda Ruiz will be the speakers at this event. It will be held at the Red Lion Hotel. It is intended to provide leadership training for women who are considering stepping into leadership roles in Lions in the future. Invitations will be extended to 10 to 20 women within the district. If anyone would like to recommend someone to be invited, please contact IPDG Marianne via phone or e-mail. Scholarship funds are available to help defray the costs.

Some Lions question the focus on women at the current time. Up until 1987 Lions was an all-male organization. When women were allowed to join, they had some catching up to do. Our current International President has a vision of achieving a 50/50 balance of women and men in our clubs. The New Voices initiative is intended to help women develop towards achieving this goal.

New brochures for the California Lions Foundation were distributed. The Foundation has decided to accept pass-through donations to assist in disaster relief along with carrying out their original mission of making grants to clubs throughout the state. The grants are matching grants up to \$5,000 and districts are allowed to have two open grants at any one time.

Budget Committee Chair Roz Squair presented the proposed budget for 2019-2020. Roz offered explanations for several line items on the budget and then responded to questions as necessary. There was much discussion of the No Dinner Dinner fundraiser and what happens to the money when the District Governor does not need it. The money goes to the District Governor and then it is their choice of what to do with it. Some of them who are more financially able to cover the costs of being Governor on their own choose to donate the money back to the District where they feel it can be of use to assist other members. Mike Ferrier moved to accept the proposed budget as amended to be placed on the ballot at Convention for approval by the membership. The motion was seconded by Ray Odom and approved by the members present.

District Governor Sue provided an update on the Carr fire and the Camp fire. When the Carr fire happened we set up a relief center and created a process and paperwork to assist fire survivors and track our donations and the number of people served. When the Camp fire occurred we took the systems created during the Carr fire and made slight modifications to open a relief center in Chico. Our District received donations from Lions clubs and individuals throughout the state and from as far away as the east coast. In addition to financial donations,

we also received truckloads of items to be passed along to those impacted by the fire. There is a coalition in place to assist with recovery efforts for the Carr fire. However, there is not yet any similar coordinated operation in place for the Camp fire. Recovery efforts for both fires will be ongoing for a long time to come. Our District has chosen to work with Paradise Adopt-A-Family to utilize the remaining funds in our disaster account designated for the Camp fire. Clubs interested in helping can sign up on paradiseadoptfamily.com and then monitor the Facebook page for needs they are able to meet.

It is almost time for our 61st Annual District Convention. It will be held at the Red Lion Hotel in Redding, California from April 12th thru 14th. Our International Guest will be International Director Tom Gordon from Canada. The theme will be Come Fly With Me. There will be a No Host dinner on Thursday evening at Cicada Cantina. Friday morning attendees will have the option to participate in the golf tournament or a special outing hosted by PDG Skip O'Brien and Laurie O'Brien. The official kick-off of the convention will take place on Friday afternoon and the USO Party-themed Food Fair will be held on Friday evening. Saturday will feature the Parade of Banners, a presentation by Rob Burroughs from the Northern California Veterans Museum, remarks from International Director Tom Gordon and the District Student Speaker Contest. The deadline for Early Bird registration is March 1st. The deadline for making hotel reservations at the Lions rate is March 21st.

There are three hotels that have indicated they will be submitting bids for the 2021 convention. They are the Best Western Miners Inn in Yreka, the Red Lion Hotel in Redding and the Twin Pines Hotel and Casino in Lake County. Presentations from the hotels will be made during our District Convention on Saturday morning.

Convention Chair Karen Marceau distributed copies of the proposed convention budget for review. Dave Jensen moved to accept the convention budget as presented. The motion was seconded by Anita Schwarm and approved by the members present.

PDG Steve Robeson reporting for Nominations Chair Frank Ely announced that we have received three nominations for the Convention Committee. They are Lynn Hartley and Marianne Keesee from Trinity Gold Diggers and Melanie Hunter from Anderson Lions. There are currently four positions open on the Humanitarian Foundation. A nomination for Tyler Spencer for 1st Vice District Governor has been received from the Enterprise Lions. A nomination for Elisa Coyle for District Governor has been received from the Enterprise Lions. PID Joe Diduca announced that the Paradise Host Club will be nominating Karen Crook for 2nd Vice District Governor. Nominations for any open positions may be submitted up until the Convention. A nomination letter must be submitted to Frank Ely by the supporting club. PDG Skip O'Brien moved to accept the nominations that have been formally submitted and place these candidates on the ballot. The motion was seconded by Anita Schwarm and approved by the members present.

PDG Steve Robeson is our District representative for the Student Speaker Foundation. During the past couple of years cumulative donations from clubs in our District have equaled far less than our District receives in award money for our contestants. To assure the continuation of the contest, we need to support the Foundation. There are a variety of methods to do this. Please encourage your clubs to consider supporting the Foundation if at all possible.

PDG Steve Robeson and Sight Conservation Chair Helen Garr reported that so far this year our District has vision screened 8,017 people. Of these people, 1,022 were referred for further evaluation.

Our annual camp for Children with Type I Diabetes will be held June 23rd through 29th at Camp McCumber. Help is needed from all clubs in the District to spread the word about the camp so that children and parents are aware of the opportunity and financial support is always welcome. The camp is for children between the ages of 8 to 17. There will be a workday at the camp sometime in May. Word will be sent out via District e-mail. Brand new pocket information cards about the Health Foundation are available for anyone who needs them. Donations for Diabetes Camp should be made payable to Lions District 4-C1 Health Foundation and not to Camp McCumber.

PDG Steve Robeson also reported that as Awards Chair he has received bulletins from three clubs for the District Contest. Bulletins may be submitted in hard copy format or via digital means. One club will be submitting their bulletin information soon. Nominations are currently being accepted for Lion of the Year, Leo of the Year and Citizen of the Year. Each club has the ability to submit a nomination for each of these categories. Nominations must be submitted to the appropriate Region Chair and must be received prior to April 1st. Nominees for Lion of the Year are not required to be a club's Lion of the Year for the prior year.

Our District Student Speaker Contest will be held on Saturday, April 13th, during our District Convention. The topic this year is "Freedom of the Press – What Does It Mean?"

PDG Maggie Robeson reported that the third annual MD-4 Melvin Jones breakfast was held at the MD-4 Convention in Sacramento. We currently have five clubs who were recognized as being 100% contributing clubs. In order to qualify, a club needs to submit a \$20 contribution for each member each year. These donations count toward a Melvin Jones for a member of the club. There is still time for clubs to submit money for Melvin Jones Fellowships to be presented at our District Convention in April.

Pull Tab Chairperson Roger Plato reported that we have collected 181 pounds of tabs so far this year. Chico Breakfast is leading in the standings with 113 pounds. Only 16 clubs have turned in tabs so far. The contest will run until June 30th.

2VDG Tyler Spencer is in the process of reworking the District 4-C1 website. He distributed a traffic report on our current website. Our website received 1,100 views in the past year. Tyler is also tracking participation on the District Facebook page. We hope to unveil the new site sometime soon. Navigation on the new site will be a little different than the current site, but it will be more interactive and hopefully more user friendly.

District Governor Sue Kerr presented awards that were handed out at the recent MD-4 Convention. The Loma Rica Foothill Club won the award for best scrapbook for 2018. The MD-4 Global Membership Award was presented to Jana Abacherli. A Grand Master Key Award was presented to PDG Joe Hinton for sponsoring 50 new members during his Lions career.

2nd Vice District Governor Tyler Spencer reminded everyone that serving as a District Governor is not inexpensive. Thus we are hosting a No Dinner Dinner to help defray the expenses of our District Governor. Clubs and individuals who wish to support the District Governor can send

contributions to Tyler and they will be accumulated and presented to the District Governor at the end of the year.

1st Vice District Governor Elisa Coyle reminded us that the deadline for submitting ads for the Convention Program and the District Directory is March 1st. Ads for just the directory may be submitted up until May 15th.

Region reports were presented as follows:

South Butte Region – Region Chair Susan Piaskowski reported that the Region has a net loss of two members so far this year. Clubs in this Region completed 19 fundraisers involving 2,843 man hours and expenditures of \$10,207. Clubs also completed 173 services projects requiring 4,398 man hours at a cost of \$28,806. Two clubs in the Region are publishing bulletins and three have active websites and/or social media sites.

Lassen Region – Region Chair Liz Pakenham was not present but submitted a written report showing that clubs in the Region completed 17 fundraisers utilizing 202 man hours during the reporting period. Clubs participated in 153 services projects expending 1,285 man hours with expenses of \$4,415. One club in the Region is publishing a bulletin and two clubs report having active social media sites. The Region Chair visited four clubs during the reporting period.

Shasta Region – Region Chair PDG John Robak reported that the Region currently has 200 members which is an increase of 5 during the reporting period. Not all clubs are reporting about their activities. From the reports received, clubs held 17 fundraisers requiring 3,111 man hours and costing \$2,000 and 32 service projects involving 4,725 man hours and \$3,935. Two clubs are publishing bulletins and four clubs have active websites. Region Chair John visited four clubs during the period. The Fort Jones Lions Club has been very, very active since the start of the Lions year. The Mountain Lions Club has done an exceptional job of building their membership. They have also been very active with service projects related to diabetes.

North Butte Region – Region Chair Oney Carrell has stepped down due to being displaced by the Camp Fire. Acting Region Chair PDG Jamie Hart reported that the region had a net loss of 4 members during the reporting period. Clubs in the Region participated in 13 fundraisers involving 228 man hours with expenses of \$2,703. Clubs completed 141 services projects which required 3,832 man hours and expenditures of \$95,927. One club is publishing a regular bulletin and five have active websites. One club completed a visitation and one progressive Melvin Jones Fellowship was awarded.

Lions Clubs International is in the process of rolling out a new website. The site is up and running, but it is still being fine-tuned. Please be patient. If you try to access a function and it does not work, try again in a couple of days.

The Melvin Jones Raffle was conducted by LCIF Chair Marilyn Moody. We stand at a balance of \$375 so we should reach the point of being able to draw a Melvin Jones winner at our upcoming Convention.

The meeting was adjourned at 2:25 pm.

It works out that \$7000 is spent on each district by the state foundation each year. So far this year we have donated \$800. It's been a long time since our district has donated our fair share to the Lions 4th District Student Speakers Foundation. Please contribute this year and every year to the "Foundation."


