You will need your membership number (your club secretary will be able to give it to you or I can, if you do not already have it). This is a great place to start if you think you might be interested in taking an officer position in the future. You will be able to learn a great deal about Lions and the offices that you could hold. It will even give you tools to use on the job for those still working and improve people skills.

Are you interested in expanding your skill set and taking on-line courses to assist you in the future with Lions, then I suggest you check out the USA/Canada Forum. It is not all that different from the Learning Center but in completing these courses you will earn a Bachelors, Masters and even a Doctorate in Lions.

I have completed several courses in both venues and after attending the USA/Canada Forum on Zoom the end of this month, I will receive my Bachelors and Masters.

I'd love to see some of you receive this award. Please contact me if you have any questions.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Let's Get Back To Work</p> <p>I stole this idea from Governor Tyler. This is his proposed theme for our next District Meeting in October.</p> <p>We are all experiencing a new way of living, working, playing and serving our community. What we had hoped would be temporary so we would be back to some semblance of normal by now has not come to fruition. We now need to make some adjustments to how we do things.</p> <p>I hope that your Lions Club is back to meeting on a regular basis. With the warm weather and intermittent good air, some clubs are meeting out of doors in parks and parking lots or in someone's spacious back yard. Being outdoors, allowing for social distancing and wearing our masks make it possible for us to connect to our Lion family. Other clubs are utilizing online meetings such as Zoom and GoToMeeting for their gatherings. Easy to use programming makes this option available to everyone. Also, the two methods can be combined by inviting your members who are at risk to join your meeting at the park via Zoom.</p> <p>Now is a good time to plan some projects for your community. Now, more than ever, many of our neighbors are experiencing hardship. Some folks need food. Some need help with home schooling. Some could use a personal contact, like a phone call, to help them during isolation. Lions can help with all this and rack up some service hours just by being a good neighbor. Be sure you are keeping track of donations to food banks, reading to your neighbor kids on Face Time, calling the widow down the street and doing a welfare check. And don't forget to report those hours on My Lion and to your District Officers.</p> <p>Let's lead the way in service in our communities.</p>	<p>Club Meetings in the Era of Covid-19</p> <p>Contact with Club Presidents has been started to find out if their clubs are meeting and, if so, how they are accomplishing it. Most are holding meetings in outdoor spaces to practice social distancing. Examples have included meeting at a nearby park, a parking lot of a church or the backyard of their President. A few have been able to meet inside, some meeting in their clubhouse or another organization's hall.</p> <p>One method which hasn't come up yet is using a video conference platform like Zoom. I know there are concerns about the privacy of using Zoom, having heard stories of people barging in to be disruptive. However, there is a way to set it up such that privacy is ensured. I have been a part of several Zoom conference calls without incident. In fact, during a recent Global Leadership Team District Coordinator call, there was mention of YouTube tutorials which were found to be fairly useful. I checked it out by doing a Google search "YouTube – Zoom" and found the three top results of "Zoom – YouTube," "Zoom – Full Tutorial" and "Zoom Basics." Clicking on each then revealed a lot more videos on subjects like how to set up a room or lounge. Try it out. It might not be as good as meeting face to face, but it still provides interaction and camaraderie.</p>

District 4-C1 Information

District Disaster Report

I wanted to thank all the Lions Clubs in District 4-C1 for once again stepping up to the plate to help the victims of the many fires that have ravaged our hills these past weeks.

Covid-19 has drastically changed how we are dealing with disasters. Evacuees from all the fires up and down California are put up in hotels by the Red Cross, there are no large evacuation centers. The first few days the Red Cross provides meals. For the next few weeks, the Salvation Army steps in to prepare meals which the Red Cross delivers to evacuees at the hotel. For the Slater and Zogg fires volunteers, including Lions Clubs, package up the meals in individual containers that the Red Cross delivers. Because evacuees are spread out and are not in a central place, it has been challenging to find ways to meet their needs. Lions from all over the district have been busy finding ways to help.

The Hope Center in Paradise and Chico have been the main resource centers for the North Butte Complex. 1st VDG Karen Crook has been the main organizer to provide volunteers for these centers. The Paradise and Chico Clubs have handed out gift cards as well as joining other Lions volunteering at these centers. Right now, the main need is for gas cards which will come out of District 4-C1 disaster funds.

When the Slater Fire erupted DG Tyler Spencer was able to obtain a \$10,000 grant from LCIF and a \$5,000 grant from California Lions Foundation. Lion Mary Smith of the Yreka Lions Club was there from the beginning to cook and provide meals for the evacuees. Using money from the grants, the district provided bedding, towels and food to those evacuated from the Happy Camp Area. Salvation Army took over the cooking, with assistance from Mary. Lions from Yreka and Ft. Jones volunteered to package meals for Red Cross to Deliver. Our thanks to all the Lions that were able to help.

The Zogg fire erupted before the efforts on the Slater fire were complete. Salvation Army has set up an area to cook and assemble meals at Cross Pointe Baptist Church in Redding. Again, Lions and other volunteers are packaging up meals to deliver.

The 4-C1 Disaster Trailer was sent north to deliver goods to Happy Camp and is now on its way down to Redding to deliver bedding, towels and food to Ono. The district will be delivering gift cards to evacuees of all the fires so that there is an opportunity to shop for individual needs.

This is just a short synopsis of some of the efforts during these fires. I know much more is happening and Lions are stepping up in every way. My heartfelt thanks to all Lions who are working so hard to help victims of these fires. The season is not over yet, but hopefully we get rain to put the fires out. The August Complex and Glass fires are still burning over several counties. Keep the first responders and those who have lost their homes in your prayers.
