

Leadership is not a matter of chance, it's a matter of choice

Everybody at one point in their life has the chance to be a leader and lead a team of individuals, whether it is in Lions Club or at work. Here are three things a leader must do to be a good leader: Direction, Focus and Motivation.

Yogi Berra said, "If you don't know where you are going, you might end up someplace else." Direction is the first guide to leadership, providing good direction will show the group what direction you are going. Provide good clear and precise direction for your club to meet your clubs' goals. You must be confident in your decisions and show your team that confidence that you believe in the direction they are going. As a leader you create direction for your team and determine what needs to be focused on to achieve the goals that are put in place. Think of it like reading a road map, you have to determine where you are going to end up before you plan a trip to get there.

George Lucas says, "Always remember, your focus determines your reality." The focus that is put in to those tasks will direct your club in the right direction. Focus is the second guide to leadership, this hinges on the kind of thoughts you think, so hold an image of the result you want, and that image will become reality. Tell your group what tasks need to be focused on to meet the goal that will lead them in the right direction. Create a plan and start with the end in mind, determine where you want your club to be, then work backwards to create focus points that will lead your club towards that mark.

Walt Disney said, "The way to get started is to quit talking and begin doing." Creating the "why" behind the direction is a key component to motivating your team. Motivating your members to focus on its clubs' goal can prove to be a challenge. One way to make it exciting and 'pump up' your team is to pair up is to focus on the purpose behind what you are trying to accomplish. Another way to instill motivation is to pair up people who have different skill sets, this can often motivate each person to be better because each person can hold the other accountable for their tasks. The last key to motivating your team is to praise them for their efforts. Nobody likes to do a bunch of work and receive no recognition for it, especially in a volunteer organization! With that said, praise your team early and often for accomplishing goals that contribute towards the direction that the club is heading.

In closing, to be a good leader in your Lions Club practice these three steps to leading a team. Give them a Direction to go, determine what to Focus on and Motivate them to get there!




LCIF NOTES

During the recent MD-4 Convention in Sacramento, a very nice Melvin Jones Breakfast was held. 100% Contributing Member Clubs were recognized and awarded plaques for their 2017-18 donations. Our District had five clubs honored:

Enterprise Scott Valley Etna, Fort Jones, Graeagle and Gridley

There are only 35 100% Contributing Member Clubs in all of California's 725 clubs. This year's contest is open until June 30. For \$20 per member, your club could join this elite group. All monies donated count toward your club's credits for a Melvin Jones Fellowship.

It is always very special if we are able to award any Melvin Jones Fellowships during our District Convention in April. Is your club interested in presenting one? Maybe it is possible to do one special fundraiser or a pass the hat collection to get your club's credits with LCIF up to \$1,000. Applications sent in the next few weeks should ensure that the plaques would be ready by Convention.

We continue to sell tickets for our own Melvin Jones Raffle for \$25 at each District Meeting. At the November meeting, PDG John Robak was the raffle winner and he will be receiving his Melvin Jones at Convention.

LCIF has launched Campaign 100 ---A Capital Fundraising Campaign to Empower Your Service. A new incentive is that when a District donates at least \$10,000 in a fiscal year, they qualify for a 15% rebate. The District Club Sharing Grant allows clubs to apply to the District for monies for any humanitarian project they do. These rebate monies stay in the District account for 10 years. In past years our District has donated more than \$10,000 many times. This sounds like a win-win situation!


Thank you again everyone that came out. Please forgive me if I missed a name but do remind me so we can count your hours.
