Position Description: Black Child Development Institute (BCDI)-Atlanta is seeking a full-time Community Health Worker to facilitate its health and wellness initiatives. The ideal candidate must demonstrate high-performance leadership skills and be comfortable and confident providing outreach in BIPOC communities serving families of young children, including childcare programs, schools, hospitals, doctor offices, and churches. Responsibilities:

- Manage the day-to-day execution of health and wellness programs.
- Serve as Health Navigator Supervisor (HNS) providing support and direction for a team of 10 Public Health Navigators (PHNs).
- Monitor COVID-19 testing events for designated partners (primarily Black churches).
- Provide technical assistance and support to PHNs and partners to ensure quality implementation of program guidelines, content and resources.
- Serve on planning and implementation teams in targeted communities.
- Coordinate and/or provide training to support program partners and stakeholders.
- Develop and collect program-specific documentation, such as legal documents, patient data, event logistics, monthly reports, surveys, etc. for multiple programs and partners.
- Work with an evaluation team to assess program goals and measures.
