Christian Essentials for a Successful Life

The Three Conversions

1. Commitment to Christ, Individual Conversion

In order for you to do the will of God and allow God's supernatural power to work in your life, you must have a personal relationship with

Jesus Christ. This involves being willing to let Jesus be Lord over your life. In other words, are you willing to give your life to Jesus? Many people are not willing and would like to simply have a little bit of spirituality or religion in their life, but not really commit themselves to Jesus. Without committing your life to Jesus, there is no individual nor inward conversion and therefore no personal relationship with Jesus. A person must surrender their life to Christ. When you, as a person, have a personal relationship with Jesus, Jesus is supernaturally working in your thoughts and in your emotions, and most importantly, in your will. You see the world more clearly in your thoughts when Jesus is in you. You are not held captive by your emotions. You have great freedom to say "no" to negative emotions and an ability to appreciate more deeply your positive emotions. You realize that emotions are an important part of life, but that serving Jesus is more important. Most of the time, you do what Jesus tells you to do rather than what your emotions tell you to do. This in turn makes us feel a whole lot better. Jesus Christ in us is the inward key to having a successful life on earth and eternal life ever after.

2. Commitment to Christ's Church, Corporate Conversion.

A person who is going to be a real Christian will not just have an inward conversion to Jesus Christ but will be outwardly converted to being in Christ's community on earth—the church. The church is full of sinful and eccentric people. In spite of all the flawed people and problems in the church, Jesus Christ is present and working in His church. The church has channels of grace within it. Grace is God's active favor—unearned and undeserved poured out upon us. In the church, we experience God's grace through sacraments through the reading and the preaching of God's word, through the gifts of the Holy Spirit that are present and are working in the individuals in the church. All these are channels of God's grace that pour God's active favor into our lives helping make us be successful. To separate yourself from the church is to separate yourself from these channels of grace. A person unwilling to attend church believes that they can lead a better life on their own rather than by receiving God's grace.

A true Christian is someone who wants to live their life by the grace of God and therefore wants to be in the church. The people in the church become channels of God's grace to guide us, to lift us up when we fall; to heal us, to show us Jesus' vision for our future. It is essential that a Christian be both converted to Jesus and to His church. You must experience both individual and corporate conversion to be a real Christian.

3. Commitment to Christs' Work, Become like Christ by Doing the Work of Christ

The third and last conversion is when you no longer want to only receive Grace from Jesus and His church, but want to be used by Jesus to be a channel of Grace to others by doing the work of Jesus Christ. This work may be small or big, but it is life changing for you and for those whom you are helping. As we are used by Jesus, we become like Jesus. As we build up others we are also built up. This process of building up is called edification—like in building an edifice. Many people want the Lord to build them up but are so self-centered and selfish that they do not want to do the work of the Lord. They do not realize it's only in giving that we receive.

To be a real Christian we need three conversions: to Jesus, to His church, and to His work. When we have all three conversions then the rest of our life comes together—because we are living in God's plan for our life. In other words, our conversion to Christ is real and not just an idea or emotion that can fade away. When we are real followers of Jesus, we are successful.

May 17, 2025, Grand Ultreya at St. Andrew's, La Mesa

It was a bright midday Saturday that welcomed a horde of Cursillistas and friends to gather for warm fellowship, delicious food, music, worship, and a wonderful Group Reunion and great witness talks. The horde began with about 33 people but eventually swelled to 47!

The Cursillo Music Saints included Bart Newsom, Alex Tuttle, Kit and Duane Chevalier, Karen and David Shine, Micky Vaieli, and Craig Mattern, kept the people's spirits rising with such songs as Shout to the Lord, As The Deer, Celebrad A Cristo, How Great Is Our God, Hosana, and Jesus My Lord.

As is customary, the people were eager for Grouping and did not want it to end.

Kathryn Bunch's **witness talk** theme was how she and us may at times be subjected to spiritual amnesia. She paraphrased John 14;7-12: Jesus said, he who has seen me has seen the Father. I'm in the Father and the Father is in me. Kathryn asked us: If Jesus came into this room, would you know him? She shared how she was confronted with unwelcomed change in her life when her husband died and The Cathedral decided that her ministry, the Cathedral Book Store, had to close. Because of her fear, she thought she needed to take advantage of her apparent legal talents by going to law school and becoming a lawyer. She spoke to then Bishop Hughes about the upcoming changes in her life. The Bishop told her that if fear has closed a door in her life, the Holy Spirit has to open it. Bishop Hughes thought she was being called by the Spirit to continue her ministry by providing her book services to people all around the Diocese. This is what she is doing at Cursillo Events and other events in various congregations in the Diocese.

The **Echo Talk** was given by Rachel Ambasing, who is employed by the Diocese as a missioner for Community Vitality and Diversity. As part of her work she has attended many of the Churches in the Diocese. She has found that it is hard for some Episcopalians to recognize Jesus in our Church. As a candidate of Cursillo #137 she learned that Christianity is not about us performing but rather is about the fullness of who we are. It is about seeing Jesus in all people. Rachel is exploring the nature of her calling. She is still not sure whether she is being called to the clergy or to some lay position in her ministry. In furtherance of her discernment, She will soon be going to Seminary School in Austin Texas.

Fr. Bob Blessing gave the Scriptural Response in which he noted that even though Adam and Eve walked with God daily, they promptly forgot Him—all it took was one bite of the apple to be banned from the Garden. Fr. Blessings advice to avoid spiritual amnesia: Read scripture regularly and continue to learn

more about and of God; Engage in Fellowship with fellow Christians. It will help you keep your wits. If you are missing God daily, you will suffer scriptural amnesia.; Consume God's word: read more, study and digest God's Word, not as a duty, but as a choice. Feed your soul.; Pray—prayer is talking with God about things—God is interested in you and your relationship with Him.
