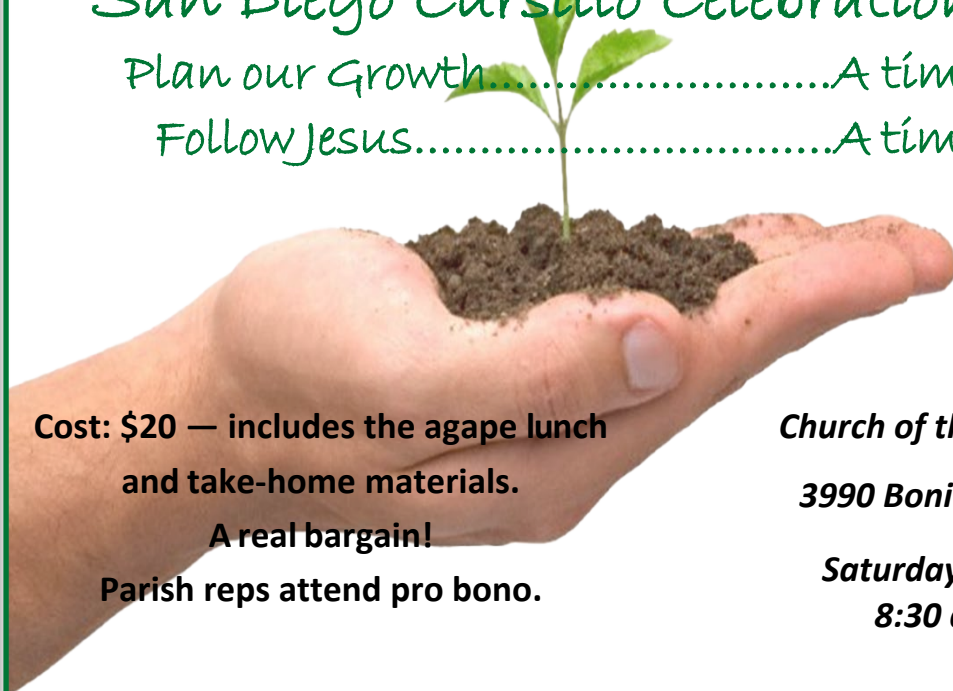

A MESSAGE FROM THE CURSILLO SPIRITUAL ADVISOR

“Welcome, Happy Morning!” A Song of Triumphant Living

The word “triumph” means to have victory, to have success, to accomplish an achievement. The word triumph should not be confused with the word “arrogant.” To be arrogant is to be prideful and pompous. In the resurrection of Jesus there is no arrogance and no room for arrogance. We encounter only the triumphant life of Jesus’s resurrection, which is the triumph of triumphs. The triumphant existence of the resurrection is one of joyful victory over all the things that can pull us down and destroy us. It is salvation! As the theologian Karl Barth has said, “The resurrection is salvation. Salvation is the resurrection.” The song, “Welcome Happy Morning!” (Hymn 179) shows the triumph of Christ’s resurrection. Let’s look at stanza #5 to let this ancient Latin hymn speak to us:

Thou, of life the author, death didst undergo,

How does Christ’s resurrection change the reality of death? When Jesus rises from the dead, He is the author of life that triumphs over death. The song says of Jesus that death didst undergo. He died, but Jesus, who says of himself, “I am resurrection and life,” is filled with the infinite life of God and as such is the author of life who can easily triumph over death. Other religions are based on a code of conduct, a path of progress. But Christianity is based on a living savior who is the author of life and who has conquered death. Jesus is not just a religious teacher, He is risen life. And His risen life is not just the way to salvation, it *is* salvation.

tread the path of darkness, saving strength to show;

Darkness refers to evil. On the cross Jesus took all the evil of the world, the sins of the whole world upon himself. Carrying his cross to be crucified and being crucified were treading the path of darkness. In Jesus paradoxically God became weak in order to show us His strength. That in the extreme weakness of Jesus carrying the sins of the world, God shows us His infinite strength. This is an important lesson for us, that when it seems like evil is going to triumph over us, we must always believe that God is stronger, that paradoxically God can show His strength during our moments of weakness. Jesus is there in the midst of our weakness even when it seems like evil is going to triumph over us, He shows up with His saving strength. He shows us His saving strength in the darkest places of our lives.

come then, true and faithful, now fulfill thy word,

The key word Here is “now.” Jesus’s resurrection is not past tense, but present tense. It is now. How does Jesus fulfill His word? The Jesus who is risen comes to us in our present moment—the now and fulfills His word through His risen presence working in us and through us. Jesus’s words spoken in the Bible come true in our lives. When we believe in Jesus’s resurrection, we see that the words that Jesus spoke come alive and are channels of God’s grace, His active favor. Our prayer is “come then, true and faithful,” Jesus. And He does come, risen and alive, fulfilling His words in us.

’tis thine own third morning! rise, O buried Lord!

In this part of the hymn, we remember that Jesus predicted that He would rise again on the third day, that in the third day Jesus would rise from the dead, triumphant over sin, death, and Satan. When Jesus triumphantly fulfills His word on the third morning, He shows us that we will rise triumphant on our third morning at the end of our lives.

“Welcome, happy morning!” age to age shall say.

In Heaven we will say, as we are resurrected, “Welcome, happy morning!” We will also say, “age to age,” which comes from the Greek words, for ages of ages, Philippians 4:20, which means eternity of eternities or forever and ever, in other words, the ultimate eternity. We will say for all eternity, “Welcome, happy morning!” filled with the joy of the resurrection of Jesus.

This Easter Sunday we not only celebrate Jesus’s resurrection, but we celebrate our own resurrection and therefore salvation. We anticipate our being resurrected into heaven and as we do this we are filled with the joy of Jesus’s resurrection in us. We sing out from the depths of our being, “Welcome, happy morning! Age to age shall say!”

Christ is risen!

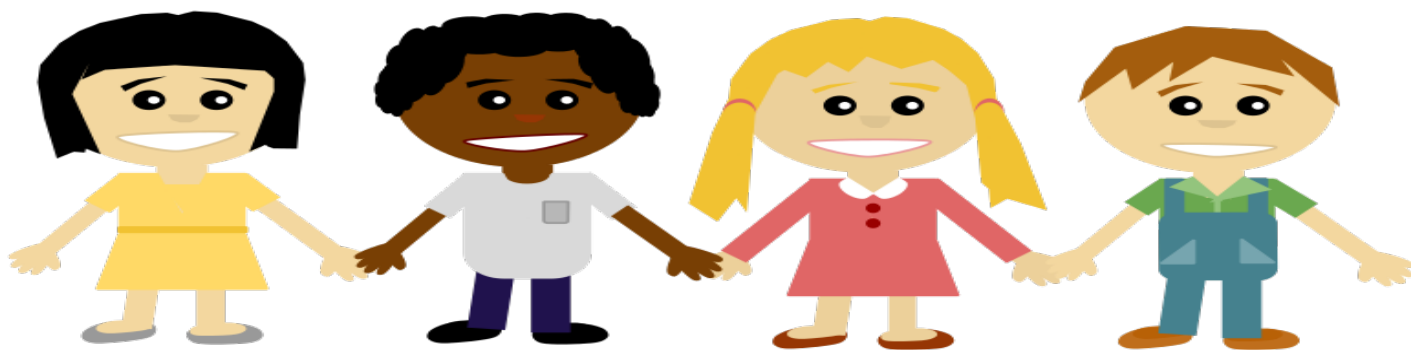

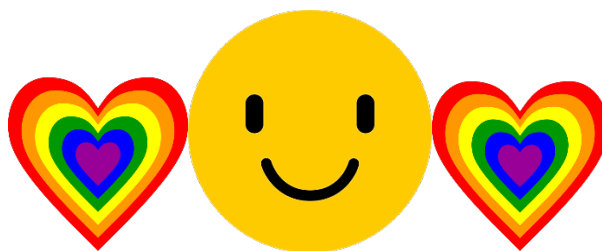
