

Sewer Ban Lifted in Flora, Opening Door to New Growth After More Than 50 Years

In a landmark moment for the community, the Indiana Department of Environmental Management (IDEM) has officially lifted the long-standing sewer ban in the Town of Flora, removing a major barrier to growth that has limited development for more than five decades.

The decision follows significant upgrades to the town's wastewater treatment plant and collection system, including an expansion of treatment capacity to 1.0 million gallons per day (MGD). The improvements ensure Flora now has the infrastructure needed to responsibly accommodate new residential and commercial development.

For years, the sewer ban restricted new connections, slowing housing construction and limiting business expansion. With the ban now lifted, local leaders say Flora is well-positioned for a new era of growth.

Immediate Impact

One of the most anticipated outcomes is the advancement of a planned 27-lot residential subdivision, which can now proceed. The additional housing will help meet local demand and attract new families to the area.

The lifted restrictions also remove obstacles for entrepreneurs and companies considering investment in Flora, creating new opportunities for job creation and long-term economic stability.

A Milestone for Carroll County

The Carroll County Economic Development Corporation (CCEDC) praised the achievement, calling it a major milestone not only for Flora but for the broader region.
