# 'Shining' sequel to film on East Beach

Stephen King's 'Doctor Sleep' reportedly stars actor Ewan McGregor; filming begins Tuesday

Warner Brothers studio has been granted state and local approval to film a movie scene on St. Simons Island's East Beach on Tuesday and Wednesday.

The film, "Doctor Sleep," is a sequel to Stanley Kubrick's 1980 classic "The Shining," and reportedly will star Scottish actor Ewan McGregor, according to Variety magazine. A studio representative did not respond to The News' request for comment by press time.

Filming will take place near the Coast Guard Station beach access between noon Tuesday and noon Wednesday, according to a permit issued by the Georgia Department of Natural Resources. Crews are allowed to begin preparing the filming site at 8 a.m. today and may con-

tinue prep work through Tuesday. They must strike the set and return the beach to its natural condition by 8 p.m. Thursday. A crew of about 80 people will be on the beach during filming and 30 more crew members will be staged in the Coast Guard Beach parking area.

The public will be barred from entering a 200 by 200 foot zone around the filming site.

"Public access may be restricted, but otherwise, all efforts will be made to allow reasonable access to

## Murder suspect back in jailhouse

A man whose murder charge in the shooting death of a former girlfriend is dead docketed in Glynn County Superior Court is back behind bars, this time for violation of his probation in an earlier shooting, according to the Glynn County Sheriff's Office.

Antoine B. Ladson is being held without bond in the Glynn County Detention Center, charged with violating probation after Brunswick Police narcotics officers arrested him on Aug. 22, charged with driving on a suspended license and willful obstruction of the law. He was released from jail the next day on \$2,326 bond. However, county sheriff's deputies picked him up Aug. 28 on a charge of violating his probation as a result of that arrest.

Ladson, 29, was sentenced

## School trail on track for spring opening

Glynn Middle School students who walk to campus could soon have a new, safer route to school, Brunswick's chief engineer told city commissioners Wednesday.

A thousand-foot long, five-foot wide concrete path is in the works for an area north of Glynn Middle that would connect Prince Street to the school, said Garrow Alberson, city engineer.

"This will allow students to walk to Glynn Middle without having to walk along Lanier Boulevard," Alberson said. "Right now, we've got kids walking in the street, and that's not safe. Unfortunately, there's not room for a continuous sidewalk along Lanier because of the marsh."

The path will include a pedestrian bridge over a tidally influenced ditch just north of Glynn Middle. The total cost will be about \$111,000, paid for with special-purpose, local-option sales tax. Alberson hopes to have the project under construction by the first of the year and expects it to take about 90 days. The hold up, he explained, is a state permit needed to

## Frederica Academy talks suicide prevention awareness

While suicide is one of the leading causes of death among youth, the subject of suicide remains a topic from which many shy away, said counseling professional Brooke Baskin during a presentation

Wednesday with Frederica Academy's high school students.

The Upper School met with Baskin, who works for St. Simons By the Sea, to discuss mental health needs and suicide prevention as part of National Suicide Prevention Awareness Month.

Mental health conditions are com-

mon among teenagers and young adults, Baskin said. About one in five people who have a mental health condition have developed the condition by age 14, she said.

"This can be very scary if you don't know what to look for, what's going on, what resources are available," Baskin said.

Frederica Academy's middle school students also met separately with Baskin later that day, said Laura Nevins, counselor of the Upper School at Frederica Academy.

Nevins said the school has annually provided information about suicide prevention, but this year school officials chose to invite Baskin to


campus.

"We decided we would love for her to come and talk with our kids, instead of just doing pamphlets," Nevins said.
