after Adams' touchdown stalled at midfield, but Jacksonville got the ball back on its 46 with 2:25 left after a 30-yard punt by JK Scott that followed a third-and-1 stop of Aaron Jones.

The Jaguars got as far as Green Bay's 36, but back-to-back sacks by Rashan Gary and Preston Smith pushed them back to their own side of the field before Jake Luton threw incomplete on fourth-and-26 to seal Jacksonville's fate.

Luton, who had thrown for 304 yards in his first career start last week, was 18 of 35 for 169 yards Sunday with one touchdown and one interception. Rodgers was 24 of 34 for 325 yards.

Green Bay entered the game as a two-touchdown favorite but had enough breakdowns to give Jacksonville hope. The Jaguars rallied from a 17-10 halftime deficit by scoring 10 points off turnovers in the second half.

Jacksonville's first

takeaway came early in the third quarter. CJ Henderson knocked the ball loose from Adams, and Myles Jack returned the fumble 16 yards to Green Bay's 16. That set up Luton's 12-yard touchdown pass across the middle to Cole.

Sidney Jones picked off Rodgers late in the third to set up Chase McLaughlin's go-ahead, 31-yard field goal with 12:44 left in the game.

Penalties proved costly for both teams.

A holding penalty on Green Bay's Billy Turner wiped out a 22-yard touchdown pass from Rodgers to Adams late in the second quarter, forcing the Packers to settle for Mason Crosby's 39-yard field goal.

Jacksonville had James Robinson's 18-yard touchdown run wiped out by a holding penalty on A.J. Cann during the fourth-quarter drive that ended with McLaughlin's field goal. The Jaguars also had a touchdown nullified by a holding penalty on James O'Shaughnessy in the third period, though they still reached the end zone a few plays later on Cole's reception.

used to be, but he's still one of the greatest to ever play. And he still hits some shots that you're like, 'Wow, I get it now.' So, it was awesome."

John Augenstein was the only other amateur to make the cut. He qualified by finishing second to Ogletree at the U.S. Amateur, losing in the championship at Pinehurst 2 and 1. Augenstein opened with a 69 and was the low amateur after 36 holes at 3 under before shooting a pair of 75s over the weekend and dropping to 55th overall, tied with Phil Mickelson.

#### OLD-TIMERS DAY

If they gave out an award for the best-finishing player from the PGA Tour Champions, 63-year-old Bernhard Langer would have collected the prize.

The two-time Masters winner from Germany shot a 1-under 71 in the final round to finish at 3-under 285 — the best score among three 50-and-older players who made the cut. Mike Weir (290) and Phil Mickelson (291) are 13 years younger and only became eligible for the PGA Tour Champions this year.

Langer also finished one stroke ahead of U.S. Open champion Bryson DeChambeau, who was the longest hitter in the tournament with an average of 324 yards

per drive. Langer was last of the 60 who made the cut, averaging 260 yards.

"I felt right in the middle of it, in the thick of it," said Langer, who played with DeChambeau in the final round. "I got to experience the longest guys in the world right now, and it's quite amazing. Different game."

Langer's game is holding up just fine. He became the oldest player in Masters history to make the cut, beating the record set two decades ago by Tommy Aaron.

Langer might set another record or two before he's done.

"You never know," he said. "I know how to play this golf course and just have to play my angles and rely on my short game. With me it's really all the putter. If I can make a few putts, I know I can shoot somewhere around par or even under, and that's usually good enough to hang in there."

The Masters rookie, who turned 29 on Thursday, earned an invitation back for 2021 by finishing at 10 under and in a tie for seventh. Pan thanked Augusta National for having him and had a special shoutout for the food.

"My wife and I, we just love all the dinners, all the sandwiches out here," he said.

Anthony Duncan got two steals during the game, and Vidmantas Kaciuska tallied six assists for the Mariners, tying his career-high.

Parks, Zack Gay and Cole Perry also all recorded a block during the matchup.

Up next for the Mariners will be a home game against Southeastern University today as the women tip-off at 5:30 p.m. with the men's game to follow.

leading rebounder with seven boards. Quira Porter led the team with two assists. Little, along with Joyce Jordan, both also recorded two steals in the game.

Coastal Georgia's eight turnovers proved to help the Mariners be successful as Warner coughed up the ball 15 times. The Mariners also made 17-of-27 free throws completing 63 percent compared to Warner's 42.9 percent.

Coastal's men also defeated Warner on Saturday as they won 84-70 over the Royals. Like the women, they improve to 3-1 on the season.

Against the Royals, the men shot 45.6 percent from the field and 40 percent from behind the arc. They also made 74.1 percent of their free-throws. The Mariners out-rebounded Warner 36 to 28 and scored 12 points off offensive boards.

Kenny Brown scored a game-high 24 points against Warner while also recording one assist and three rebounds.

Jordan Parks tallied 15 points and 10 rebounds, earning him his third double-double of the season. Those 10 boards were a game-high for Parks.
