October 22, 1992 was a day for speeches as Benefield Hall, the new Middle School, was dedicated honoring the Benefield Family. All Frederica's students and faculty were present and Lower School students, including three of the Benefield grandchildren, Riley, a second grader, Jack and Harrison, first graders, sang for the guests of honor.

Speeches were given by board chairman, Lee Tompkins, and Mr. James Dewey Benefield. A blessing was given by Rev. Ron Watson. There was a presentation and ribbon cutting, after which guests toured the new facility.
