Glynn Academy comes up short in region matchup vs. Richmond Hill

Glynn Academy struggled to gain traction offensively Friday night as the Terrors slid out of the playoff picture with a 14-7 road loss to Richmond Hill.

The Terrors scored a touchdown in the opening minutes of the second quarter when running back Zech Ellis took a direct snap and ran 21 yards to paydirt to tie the game at 7-7, but Glynn (3-5-1, 2-3 Region 2-6A) wouldn't push the score any further.

"I just think it's kind of been more of we haven't been

real good on execution," said Terrors head coach Rocky Hidalgo of his team's offensive woes. "We jumped offsides on 3rd and 1, there's just lots of little things in the game — running the wrong route — that's kept us from being successful."

Richmond Hill (3-5, 3-2) took the opening kickoff and moved down the field quickly via the pass. A 26-yard scoring pass from quarterback Ty Goldrick to Tommy Bliss got the Wildcats on the board for a 7-0 lead just four minutes into the game.

Glynn tied the contest on Ellis' touchdown, but Richmond Hill went back to

the air — getting a 46-yard completion down inside the 5 to set up a 1-yard rushing touchdown.

Tyson Rooks intercepted a Richmond Hill pass to prevent the Wildcats from adding to their lead before halftime, and in the third quarter, Glynn Academy recovered a fumble near midfield, trailing by a score.

But the Terrors failed to capitalize on either turnover with points of their own.

Glynn opened the third quarter on the Richmond Hill 34 looking to tie the score when the Wildcats picked off a Tyler Devlin pass at the 4-yard line.

The Terrors eventually forced the Wildcats to punt the ball back with just over seven minutes to play, but after taking over at its own 21, Glynn was unable to move down field, kicking the ball back with 3:47 remaining.

Richmond Hill was able to run the clock out to secure a victory that moves the Wildcats into sole possession of fourth place in the region.

"Our kids played hard on both sides of the football," Hidalgo said. "We just haven't made enough plays to win."

For Glynn, the offensive

Triplett leads Knights to third straight win

The third straight monster game from star running back Jordan Triplett propelled Frederica Academy to a 44-6 victory over St. Andrew's on Friday in Savannah.

Triplett entered the matchup having racked up nearly 400 rushing yards and nine touchdowns over the past two contests, and he closed in on the 300-yard mark against the Saints to go along with six more scores.

"We ran the ball well," said Knights head coach Brandon Derrick. "I thought Thomas (Veal) threw the ball, when we needed to in spots, really well."

"We looked a little slow after last week's physical football game, but I thought our kids came out and played hard."

Frederica (4-4, 2-0 Region 2-3A) opened its region slate last week with a hard-fought victory over rival Bulloch Academy, and it maintained its focus to win its third consecutive contest following a four-game skid.

St. Andrew's (3-3, 0-2) was fresh off a bye, but two weeks ago it was handed a 50-19 defeat at the hands of Pinewood Christian. With a potential region championship deciding clash against the same Patriots on the horizon for the Knights, they did their part to remain undefeated in the division.

"It's a trap game, that's what that is," Derrick said. "You play those teams that aren't rival games, and you play a really good team the week before — you give a ton of effort — then you have

Second half sinks Camden vs. Tift Co.

Tift County controlled the third quarter of a crucial Region 1-7A matchup Friday to turn the tides against Camden. The Wildcats fell 21-14 to the Blue Devils at Brodie Field.

The Wildcats (4-5, 0-2) led 7-0 at halftime, but the contest turned in the second half as the Blue Devils (6-3, 1-1) used nearly the entirety of the period to score a pair of touchdowns.

Trailing by a score, Tift County took the opening kickoff in the third quarter and drove down field to tie the game at 7-7 on a rushing touchdown with 5:41 remaining in the pe-

riod. Then, the Blue Devils followed the score with a surprise onside kick, which they recovered to get right back to work on offense.

Once five more minutes had ticked off the clock, Tift got into the end zone on a touchdown pass to take a 14-7 lead with just 51 seconds left in the quarter.

Following a quick Camden punt, Tift County padded its advantage with a 50-yard touchdown run less than a minute into the fourth. The Wildcats responded a few plays later on Jamie Felix's 62-yard touchdown jaunt, but

disparity between wins and losses has been an ongoing pattern throughout the year. The Terrors have averaged 36.0 points in their three wins, and 11.6 points in the

other six contests.

While Glynn Academy's streak of 13 straight post-season appearances is in danger, it hasn't come to an end just yet. The regular-season finale against Statesboro at Glynn County Stadium will likely wind up deciding the fourth seed.

"Next week, we're going to take some time off, only practice twice," Hidalgo said. "And then we're going to come back the following week, have a great week of practice, and go get after Statesboro. We've got to finish games. We've got to make plays. We're not doing that."

to come back the next week. We were a little sluggish, but I thought our kids did a good job to go up here and take care of business."

Frederica led 9-0 through one quarter, and it pushed the advantage to 23-0 by halftime. The Knights led

37-6 heading into the fourth quarter before scoring one last touchdown on the night.

Over the past three games, Frederica is averaging 43.6 points per contest — the uptick in offensive production coincides with starting signal caller Veal's return from injury.

"I think Thomas coming back gives us a little bit of a chance to stretch the field with Bryce (Reilly) out

there, and Blake (Holloway), all of our receivers, Kwon (Vaughn), all those guys," Derrick said. "We've been able to stretch the field a little bit and take some pressure off the box. Jordan can run it up inside, but we can also throw it out there when we need to and get 5-10 yards and move the chains."

"I think the ability to be able to throw the ball downfield really helps us."
