Dear Brothers and Sisters at Messiah,

My first year at Messiah has been one of many challenges and joys. Moving to Long Island and getting established was and continues to be difficult, given the general state of affairs gripping the country in 2020-2021. But it has also been a challenging time for Messiah as we have navigated the terrain of a post-COVID

world, with capacity restrictions, quarantines, and the anxieties that come with an invisible, infectious agent. But, in spite of these tests, we have weathered the storm and come out on the other side.

Indeed, much good has happened during this unprecedented year!

Since my arrival last summer, we returned to in-person worship services and began a long (and fruitful) campaign to upgrade our streaming capability to connect more people to our worship services. Despite some initial hiccups, we now have a streaming camera set-up that rivals some TV studios! We were able to celebrate Christmas together—our first big festival together since the start of the shut-downs early last year. I even spent the night from Christmas Eve into Christmas Day at the church just in case the big windstorm that was expected did anything that could have affected services. We were able to celebrate Easter together after Easter had previously been “cancelled.” We celebrated the next generation of leaders in the church with seventeen students confirmed at Messiah in November and May. Two people were joined in holy matrimony this spring, and to top it all, we welcomed a new member into Christ’s church through Holy Baptism in April. In addition to all this, we started new Bible studies and new fellowship opportunities – most recently with an after-church coffee hour.

With all these good things, we have also experienced sorrow, including the deaths of several members of the congregation, Eleanor Walsh, Edna Milany, and Dorothy Doscher, and of our founding pastor, Rev. Henry Koepchen.

And just as we have experienced some new beginnings, we have also experienced the endings of some things this year, namely the closing of the Messiah Preschool and Daycare after some 20

years of service to the community. I know that we are all so very thankful for our director, Wendy Mendriski, Pastor Bell, and all the teachers who have served the preschool and daycare over the years. Their hard work and dedication have touched the lives of many children at Messiah and in the Three Villages. While the ending of this program is a sad occasion, I nonetheless trust that God will continue to guide us at Messiah and present us with new opportunities and ideas for worship and life together, including more opportunities to reach out to our community here in the Three Villages. Pastor Unger and I have continually challenged and encouraged all of us to contemplate the ways in which God is calling us to be the Church to one-another and in our community. Think on these things: How is God calling us and challenging us to use our gifts and talents to reach people in our community? How is He calling us and challenging us to use our gifts and talents to strengthen our mutual life and faith at Messiah, and to *grow together* in faith, hope, and love? I invite you to join us in contemplating this calling we have been given, both for our life together *right now* and to continue to reinvigorate our ministry at Messiah as we go forward.

This summer we have an opportunity to make up for lost time. Thankfully, more and more people are returning to church, now that the threat of COVID has diminished, and it gives us an opportunity to return to first principles regarding who God wants us to be. St. Luke writes in Acts, chapter two, that the congregation of believers in Jerusalem following Pentecost “were continually devoting themselves to the apostles’ teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer” (Acts 2:42, NASB). Let us likewise devote ourselves to these things, caring for one another and our neighbors and coming together to worship and receive God’s gifts, being who Christ has called us to be in our baptism.



**AN UPDATE ON MASKS IN WORSHIP:**  
**Effective June 15, 2021 New York State lifted COVID-19**  
**restrictions as 70 percent of New Yorkers aged 18 or older**  
**have received the first dose of their COVID-19 vaccination**  
**series.**

Given that the CDC has advised that fully vaccinated individuals do not need to wear masks and 70 percent of New Yorkers over the age of 18 have received the first dose of their COVID-19 vaccination series, as a result, **the wearing of masks while attending services at Messiah will now be optional.** As the safety and wellbeing of our congregation is of the utmost importance to us, we respect the rights of all people at Messiah to choose what is best for them and their families at this time.

**The wearing of masks will be left to individual discretion.**


Can't make Tuesdays? Come any day you can. Speak to one of the members of the Garden Club for more information.
