## From Pastor Niemeier

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ at Messiah,

*"Non scholae, sed vitae discimus."* This Latin saying was the motto of a summer Latin language camp I attended in 2008. It means, "we learn, not for school, but for life." But the original form of this saying was different when the Roman author Seneca wrote it nearly 2000 years ago. Instead, he wrote "we learn, not for life, but for school." What he meant by that was that we often feel that we are being taught to the test, only reading and learning some subjects merely because that's what one sometimes does in school. I'm sure many of our students returning to classes this fall can sympathize with Seneca's original quotation--I know I did at their age, especially when the time for standardized tests came around.

But Seneca's original phrasing does not describe our learning in the church, for in the church, we truly do learn "for life"--for eternal life, no less! That's why we teach our children about the Bible; that's why we come to church on Sunday to hear God's Word and the sermon further explaining it; that's why we send our children to Sunday school and Catechism classes; and that is why we go to Bible studies and prayer groups and fellowship groups. In all these things, our understanding of God's Word and will for us is deepened and strengthened. These things help us grow, especially in our lives as Christians. And God's Word imparts life to those who believe it. So when we study the Word and spend time deepening our understanding of it, we really are "learning for life, not for school." In this case, learning makes us more alive by strengthening our faith and granting us eternal life by that faith!

So, as we collectively enter a new school year, I encourage you, if you are not already doing so, to spend time learning for life and not for school. Perhaps that will take the form of reading the Bible with your children at home and

discussing the week's lessons with them. Perhaps it is in doing your confirmation homework (or parents, perhaps it lies in helping you children with their work). Maybe it's in joining the women's Bible study. Or perhaps it is in diligently and assiduously coming to church each Sunday to hear God's Word and receive the sacraments. Life comes from the Word of God, and when it comes to our ears and minds through hearing, reading, meditation, and study, it does not return to God empty, but accomplishes that for which he sends it out (Isaiah 55:11).

In all these things, I pray that you learn for life, and not for school!




