PASTOR NIEMEIER'S NOTE:

Dear Brothers and Sisters at Messiah,

If you've ever been in my office, you've probably noticed that I have a plastic model of a human skull on one of my bookshelves. Its reason for being there is partly kind of silly–I wanted my desk to look like St. Jerome's in Caravaggio's famous painting of him (he has a skull on his desk that he is contemplating as he writes)--but it's also serious, because the skull serves as something called a *memento mori*. That's a Latin phrase that means "Remember [you are going] to die." Historically, the season of Lent was a time for contemplating mortality and for disciplining the flesh in order to grow in faith and moral conduct. Remembering death, therefore, helped a person strive for a "good death" following a life that was increasingly marked by faith in Christ and holy living. If we remember that we are going to die, then we remember to die to self and trust in Christ. It's not as morbid as it seems.

But how we die says a lot about us-specifically it says a lot about who we are in Christ. And one thing that I've discovered in the last few years is that, when people die and I am called to conduct their funerals, in many cases no one seems to know a whole lot about the deceased's faith and what they understood about what Christ has done for them, nor do they have any kind of instructions regarding what they would like to have read or sung for them. (Note: I'm not talking about people here at Messiah-the vast majority of funerals I conduct are for people in the wider community.) And that's a real shame, because as has so often been said, funerals are not for the dead, but for the living. A funeral, properly conducted, tells those of us "left behind" about what Jesus has done in the life of the deceased so that the rest of us may have hope in Him also. Maybe the reason why so many folks don't have their funeral wishes recorded is because we, as a society, don't like to think about death all that much. COVID brought the specter of it back into our lives, but for the most part, we in the West try to keep death out of sight and out of mind. And when we put mortality out of mind, it's not surprising that we don't think about what we want to preach through our funerals. The only problem is, when death comes (as it must), and we haven't given any thought to this, then our loved ones (or even strangers) are put in a position to offer a testimony for us, and it may not be the one we want.

I don't want that to happen to you, brothers and sisters. I don't want your families to be confused as to what you want your funeral to preach. I want you to have peace of mind that your funeral will reflect your faith in the promised hope that Christ has given us. So I encourage you to plan your funeral ahead of time. And I offer you my help in doing this (I even have planned my own funeral). I know the act of planning a funeral before you are anywhere near death sounds macabre, but it can really help you to examine your faith and give you peace of mind. It will help give your families peace of mind, too, and they will thank you. I (or whichever pastor officiates) will also thank you because you will have helped me give an accurate account of *your* hope and *your* faith, so that all who are present will know about Jesus' love for you and them.

So if you would like my help in planning, give me a call or drop by the church office. I can give you a planning guide and we can work together to make sure your final testament proclaims the One who, by His death, has undone death and has given you the gift of everlasting life. Help me help you to remind those present at the graveside that, though we will die, in Christ we will live (*memento vivere*)!
