Dear Mr. President,

We request your Administration's urgent attention to the recent unjust detention of U.S. citizen and Virginia resident Mr. Asim Ghafoor by United Arab Emirates (UAE) authorities. Mr. Ghafoor has been convicted on unsubstantiated charges of money laundering and tax evasion. His detention represents a violation of his due process rights as he was unable to seek legal counsel and was not given proper notice of these charges. Mr. Ghafoor has been sentenced to three years in prison as of July 16, 2022, only two days after being unjustly detained.

Mr. Ghafoor is a board member for the nonprofit organization Democracy in the Arab World Now (DAWN), which advocates for democratic reforms in the Middle East and has at times criticized the Emirati government. This and his reported representation of Mr. Jamal Khashoggi, a Virginian murdered by Saudi officials, raises a clear need for concern over the validity of this arrest.

While we appreciate your recent Executive Order to deter the wrongful detention of Americans abroad, we urge you to meet with President Sheikh Mohammed bin Zayed al Nahyan immediately on this issue and to raise Mr. Ghafoor's case. Your relationship with the UAE government puts the White House in a strong position to advocate for Mr. Ghafoor's fair treatment and urge them to ensure he is safe while in UAE custody and granted bail.

In addition to the above, without evidence that Mr. Ghafoor engaged in criminal behavior, it is concerning that the UAE also is claiming that the United States contributed to this rights violating detention. Similar to our fellow federal legislators, we welcomed the July 18th statement from the Department of State that Mr. Ghafoor's arrest had not been "not sought" by their department. However, despite this statement, the UAE continues to claim the United States coordinated the arrest of Mr. Ghafoor as part of efforts to help "combat transnational crimes." We agree that this raises concerns about oversight of potential U.S. involvement in that partnership.

As your Administration works to ensure that Mr. Ghafoor is treated humanely and fairly, including access to required medical care due to him reportedly experiencing COVID-19 complications after contracting the virus while in jail. We join our federal colleagues and respectfully request that you take the following interim measures:

1. Request that Mr. Ghafoor be immediately granted reasonable bail and time to prepare his defense.
2. Call on Emirati authorities to allow Mr. Ghafoor regular access to his family and to his attorneys.
3. Ensure that the U.S. embassy continues to receive consular visits with Mr. Ghafoor and that U.S. embassy staff are permitted to attend all trial proceedings.
4. Confirm with UAE officials that Mr. Ghafoor will receive humane and fair treatment while in Emirati custody, including immediate access to required medical care.
