O'Donnell to lead Big Top Parade



Former Circus World head named grand marshal

After more than a decade helping to organize the [Big Top Parade](#) as executive director of Circus World, Scott O'Donnell will lead this year's event as grand marshal.

Last fall O'Donnell finished his second stint at Circus World, a state historic site located on the Ringling Brothers' original winter quarters in Baraboo. Working with the Baraboo Area Chamber of Commerce and a parade committee,



O'Donnell helped recruit entries and set the parade order since his return in 2013. On June 14, he'll ride in the parade as grand marshal.

"After all these years setting up the parade, it'll be great to see Scott get a chance to enjoy the ride," said Nanci Jenks, co-chair of the parade committee.

Each summer the Ringling Brothers' hometown celebrates its circus heritage with an old-fashioned parade through the streets of downtown Baraboo. Upwards of 75 entries – from historic

Celebrity judges to preside over circus parade

An all-star panel of celebrity judges will preside over Baraboo's [Big Top Parade](#) on June 14. Miss Wisconsin Mandi Genord, Wisconsin Historical Society Director and CEO Christian Overland and "Discover Wisconsin" host Lindsey Hayes will lead the parade before being dropped off at the judges' stand to choose the top entries.

"We're honored to have such esteemed statewide celebrities participate in our parade," said Nanci Jenks, chair of the Big Top Parade organizing committee. "With dozens of entries from Circus World wagons to marching bands to community floats, our judges always face a tough task."

The parade through the streets of downtown Baraboo will be the centerpiece of a weekend full of circus-themed fun in the Ringling Brothers' hometown.

BACC FOUNDATION OFFERS FIRST ROUND OF GRANTS

The Baraboo Area Chamber of Commerce Foundation, which was formed by the Chamber last year, is launching its first-ever grant program, open to area nonprofits and quasi-governmental organizations. The Foundation's purpose is to carry out the charitable and educational objectives as described below:



- Charitable – The charitable objectives of the Foundation shall focus on the advancement of education and/or the arts in the Baraboo area; the erection or maintenance of public buildings, monuments, or works; and the lessening of burdens on local government.

- Educational – The educational objectives of the Foundation shall focus on developing and supporting partnerships between local educational institutions and the surrounding business community in order to supplement the educational experience of local students, enhance their workforce preparedness, and provide instruction to the public on subjects useful and beneficial to the Baraboo area business community.

If your organization qualifies as a charitable, not-for-profit 501(c)(3) tax-exempt organization under the Internal Revenue Service Code guidelines, or is a governmental or quasi-governmental entity; and your organization is located in the Baraboo area; and your organization has a request that is specific to the Foun-

dation's purpose, you may apply for a grant. Complete the grant application form found by following the button in the email that delivered this newsletter. Download the form and save it to your computer before filling it out.

Funding for the grants was raised through voluntary donations from more than 340 Chamber members. To those members, we extend our deep appreciation.

Applicants may apply for up to \$1,000 in funding. Application deadline is Aug. 1 and the announcement of recipients will be made no later than Oct. 1. The determination of grant recipients will be made by the Foundation's three-person Board of Directors, comprised of Dan Lewison, TRICOR LLC, President; Nicole Marklein, Cross, Jenks, Mercer & Maffei, Vice President and Treasurer; and Teddie Szydlowski, Community First Bank, Secretary. In addition to my duties as Executive Director of the Chamber, I serve in the same capacity for the Foundation.



Registration is open for Chamber Golf Classic

In less than three months, it will be time to hit the links when the Chamber hosts its annual Golf Classic at Baraboo Country Club. The event is set for Tuesday, June 24, with a shotgun start at 11 a.m., followed by dinner at Fore Seasons Restaurant.

Developers of proposed hotel to host public input meetings

The developers of a proposed hotel and vacation villa complex in Baraboo will host two public input sessions in the coming weeks. Baraboo Bluff Hospitality LLC is proposing to build an 80-room hotel and 31 vacation villas on a 17-acre parcel of property on Baraboo's south side near Tumbled Rock Brewery & Kitchen.

The meetings will be held at the Carnegie-Schadde Memorial Public Library in Baraboo on Saturday, April 19, from 10 a.m. to noon, and on Tuesday, April 22, from 6 to 7:30 p.m.

The project will support the demand



for recreational housing, small group functions, and eco-tourism, according to the developers. The project is designed to retain and capture the natural beauty of the area while respecting the unique geography, native habitat, and wildlife resources. The project

includes plans for e-bike rentals, e-car charging stations, and solar heating.

In addition to providing convenient access to Devil's Lake State Park, the project will include shuttle bus service to help guests visit Downtown Baraboo and other local attractions.

According to the developers, the project will create jobs, benefit local contractors, and generate property tax revenue and room tax revenue that will benefit the City of Baraboo and local residents. For information, click the link in the email that brought you this newsletter.

Circus World wagons to marching bands to community floats – are expected. Set for Flag Day, this year's parade will adopt a patriotic theme.

"The American circus has celebrated patriotism since its inception," O'Donnell said. "For more than a century, circus parades have draped themselves in red, white and blue."

O'Donnell first came to Circus World as operations manager in 2003. He went on to become vice president and general manager of The Big Apple Circus. After a stint with concert giant Live Nation, O'Donnell returned to



lead Circus World in 2013.

"It's totally fitting to honor Scott's years of service to Circus World and to our parade by naming him grand marshal," said George Althoff, execu-

tive director of the Chamber.

The parade will step off at 11 a.m. on Saturday, June 14, highlighting a weekend full of circus-themed fun in Baraboo. That night, the Al. Ringling Theatre will screen the 2003 Tim Burton film "Big Fish," which featured O'Donnell's circus. He will lead a talk-back session after the movie.

The circus weekend will begin Thursday, June 12 when Professor Stich's Original Circus Band performs at Concerts on the Square. It continues the next night as the theatre presents Charlie Chaplin's 1928 feature "The Circus," accompanied by the mighty Barton organ.

Evaluating each entry will be Genord, a Beaver Dam native who is ending her reign as Miss Wisconsin; Overland, who oversees Wisconsin historic sites like Circus World and serves on the Governor's Council on Tourism; and Hayes, a Regional

Emmy Award-winning host and producer who grew up in Sauk County.

The judges will choose the parade's top overall entry, as well as the best commercial and nonprofit entries. Upwards of 75 entries are expected to enter the parade, which will step off at 11 a.m. June 14. Held on Flag Day, this year's Big Top Parade is adopting a patriotic theme.

"This will be a star-spangled celebration," said George Althoff, Executive Director of the Baraboo Area Chamber of Commerce. "We encourage everyone – from parade entries to our celebrity judges to spectators along the parade route – to wear red, white and blue."

BTG presents new play this weekend

A new product will hit the market April 4-6 when Baraboo Theatre Guild presents "Inconvenience Store" at the Al. Ringling Theatre.

Written by Ben Bromley of Baraboo, the new comedy features a mismatched band of Cheeseheads who find themselves trapped inside a convenience store during a hellacious storm and a robbery attempt.

"Our board jumped at the opportunity to produce a new play written by one of our members," said Katie James, Baraboo Theatre Guild president. "Taking a new play from the page to the stage can be an invaluable opportunity for the cast and crew, as well as the playwright."

Director Scott Rawson set the cast of eight actors and is leading them in rehearsals, with help from assistant Emily Reno. "Building a production from the ground up is a special challenge," Rawson said. "The cast is

enjoying Ben's often wacky, sometimes thoughtful dialogue."

"Inconvenience Store" is full of references to Wisconsin's cultural institutions. It's populated by characters who audiences may feel like they've met in real life. "This is a play about Wisconsin, from Wisconsin, and for Wisconsin," Bromley said.

Leading the cast are Dale Loomis as a wisecracking customer, Sydney Van Gelder and Chelsea Duffield as clerks and Carroll McDonald as the bun-

gling robber. They're joined by Genny Petrulis as the local space cadet, Ben Raupp as the store manager, Michael Riley as a disgruntled customer and Brian Domenget as a cop.

The new comedy will be Bromley's second play at the Ringling Theatre. His first, titled "Fishwrap" and based on his experiences in the newspaper industry, was staged as a fundraiser for "the Al." in 2014.

"I'm grateful to the BTG board for taking a chance on an unknown play," Bromley said. "I think the cast and the audience will smile as they see a mirror held up to their faces as Wisconsinites."

Performances are set for 7 p.m. Friday, April 4; 2 p.m. and 7 p.m. Saturday, April 5; and 5 p.m. Sunday, April 6. Tickets are available via the theatre [website](#).
