- If you happen to have an exposure, are waiting on a COVID test result, or are not feeling well, please do not return to school until you are healthy and symptom free.
- Masking does make a difference. Please remember masks both on and off campus.
- Over the winter holidays and likely over spring break, too, we ask that families consider returning home 72 hours prior to a return to school. We realize this may not be popular, but we want to encourage everyone to take health precautions while on holiday.
