FAFSA

On October 1, students may begin filling out the [Free Application for Federal Student Aid](#) (FAFSA).

This affects seniors most immediately, but all families should consider learning a bit about this process now. For instance, [here is some advice for all families about maximizing FAFSA opportunities](#), with regard to retirement and student savings.

Public colleges and universities and some private institutions rely on FAFSA to determine need-based financial aid, and many private institutions tie their financial support to completion of the FAFSA (or another form called [the CSS Profile](#)). Georgia students can benefit from completing the FAFSA as a step toward HOPE/Zell Miller eligibility. Many schools and colleges have a financial aid deadline as well as an application deadline, so we recommend that families apply as early as possible and in advance of college decisions.
