All of your prayers were so helpful to me when I was recovering last summer, and I know these families will need all the support and prayers we can give them during this difficult time.

As more information comes out, it is clear that this shooting should have been prevented before it happened. The FBI and local police had been alerted to the shooter's suspicious behavior months before the shooting, and the school had at least one armed sheriff's deputy on the scene who hid instead of engaging the shooter and saving lives. My life was saved by the two Capitol police officers with me at the baseball field who engaged and took down the shooter, and stopped him from killing anyone on that field. It is clear with the Parkland shooting that there were many breakdowns in the system already in place that were designed to prevent these tragedies. We need to find out why these breakdowns occurred, and hold those people accountable who failed to stop this shooter before he killed 17 innocent victims. I wish there was some magic legislation that would stop the next tragedy from happening, but rather than further limiting the rights of law-abiding citizens, we need to find out why so many laws
