**Day 1: Monday, September 6, 2027 • Departure**

Our adventure starts today as we depart the USA on our scheduled flight to Athens, Greece.

**Day 2: Tuesday, September 7, 2027 • Athens**

Upon our arrival in Athens, we meet our local tour manager and coach driver and transfer into the city center. A short walk takes us to the New Acropolis Museum, built in 2009 at the bottom of the Acropolis. Our tour of the museum introduces us to Greek culture, mythology, politics, and religion. Later, we stroll through the Plaka, the old, historical neighborhood of Athens, where we enjoy the sights and sounds of this ancient city. Dinner is at our hotel tonight. **D**

**Day 3: Wednesday, September 8, 2027 • Athens**

After breakfast, we transfer to the Acropolis, where our tour manager introduces us to the Parthenon, the Propylaea, the Erechtheion and the temple of Athena Nike, iconic landmarks of Athens' skyline. We continue our exploration of the Greek capital on a panoramic city tour that bring us past the Temple of Zeus, the Panathenaic Stadium, Syndagma (Constitution) Square and the Roman Agora. We have free time this afternoon to explore more of the museums and markets on the Plaka and Monastiraki Square. Returning to our hotel for dinner. **B/D**

**Day 4: Thursday, September 9, 2027 • Athens**

Today's destination is Cape Sounion. At the southernmost tip of the peninsula, surrounded on three sides by the Aegean Sea, are the ruins of the Temple of Poseidon, the Greek god of the sea. The English poet Lord Byron felt compelled to carve his name into the base of one of the columns, still visible 150 years later. In the afternoon, we visit a local winery for a guided tasting of Greek wine. We return to our hotel for dinner. **B/D**

**Day 5: Friday, September 10, 2027 • Aegean Sea Cruise**

We depart early to board a cruise ship, our home for the next three nights as we cruise to some of the most famous islands in the Aegean Sea. Enjoy the passing scenery from the deck before we dock at Mykonos, a picture-perfect island of windmills, whitewashed houses and blue-domed churches. A shuttle bus takes us from the cruise dock to the harbor area, where we have free time to explore the streets and shops of this island paradise.

**Day 6: Saturday, September 11, 2027 • Aegean Sea Cruise**

We dock at Kusadasi, Turkey, and depart after breakfast for our excursion to Ephesus. Our local guide takes us back thousands of years to when Ephesus was a major trading center on the Mediterranean and one of the twelve cities of the Ionian League. The Temple of Artemis that once stood here is considered to be one of the Seven Wonders of the Ancient World. Our visit to Turkey ends with a short stroll through the Bazaar, where if timing permits, we can bargain for leather, jewelry, and other souvenirs. This afternoon, we stop at the island of Patmos and take tender boats to the harbor. The optional shore excursion in Patmos is a tour of St. John's Monastery and the Grotto of the Apocalypse. Steep stone stairs lead from the chapel of St. Anne to the cave where it is said St. John received his visions from Christ that he recorded in the Book of Revelation. **B/L/D**

**Day 7: Sunday, September 12, 2027 • Aegean Sea Cruise**

Our day begins as we tour the Minoan palace of Knossos on the island of Crete. Considered the first advanced civilization of Europe, the Minoans were merchants who traded with Ancient Egypt and Mycenae on the mainland of Greece. The palace is known for its many restored frescoes and mythological site where the half man/half bull Minotaur was imprisoned. We returned to our ship and

have lunch while cruising northward to the island of Santorini. With whitewashed villages clinging to volcanic cliffs, this island's harbor is one of the most dramatic in Greece. We visit Oia, Santorini's most beautiful and picturesque village, before returning to our ship for our final sunset on board. **B/L/D**

**Day 8: Monday, September 13, 2027 • Napflion**

Today we disembark in Piraeus port and head west, stopping at the stunning Corinth Canal, an engineering marvel that connects the Aegean Sea to the Ionian Sea. A short distance from here, we tour the archeological site of Ancient Corinth, with its Greek and Roman ruins. Our day continues with a visit to see the ruins of the palace Mycenae and the Tomb of Clytemnestra. After lunch in the nearby town of Mykines, we drive to Epidavros, whose famous 4th century BC theater has near perfect acoustics. Our destination is the resort town of Navplio with its well-preserved old town. There will be an opportunity to "volta" (take a stroll) along the cobblestone streets with the locals this evening. **B/D**

**Day 9: Tuesday, September 14, 2027 • Ancient Olympia**

We continue to the Peloponnese Peninsula to Sparta, a once powerful city-state that often clashed with Athens for power in Ancient Greece. Upon our arrival, we visit the Museum of Olives and Greek Olive Oil, where we learn more about Greece's most famous agricultural products. We enjoy sampling olives and olive oil from the Kalamata region before continuing to Ancient Olympia. **B/D**

**Day 10: Wednesday, September 15, 2027 • Delphi**

After breakfast, we visit the ruins of Ancient Olympia, home of the first Olympic Games. Our walk takes us to where the early athletes trained and competed, as well as to the site where the Olympic flame is still lit prior to the Summer and Winter Olympic Games. Nearby, we visit the Archaeological Museum of Olympia and see artifacts recovered from the site. After lunch on our own, we drive across the impressive Charilaos Trikoupis Bridge, which spans the Gulf of Corinth, to return to the Greek mainland. Dinner and overnight in Delphi. **B/D**

**Day 11: Thursday, September 16, 2027 • Athens**

Today we visit Delphi, a religious site that the Ancient Greeks considered the center of the world. Our tour includes the Sanctuary of Apollo, the Athenian Treasury and the Delphi Museum, with its most famous resident: a bronze charioteer from 470 BC. Visit to nearby Arachova, a village on the southern slope of Mount Parnassos. Return to Athens and have dinner in the hotel. **B/D**

**Day 12: Friday, September 17, 2027 • Athens**

This morning, we depart for a half day tour to Corinth with lunch in a local restaurant. This afternoon return to Athens with time free until dinner. This evening, we celebrate our Greek odyssey with our farewell dinner at a taverna. Here we enjoy traditional Greek food, local musicians will perform songs and dances from various regions of Greece. **B/D**

**Day 13: Saturday, September 18, 2027 • Return**

Sadly, we say "Yiasou!" (Goodbye!) to Greece as we transfer to the Athens International airport for our return flight to the United States. We take with us memories of ancient cities, new friends, fascinating legends and spectacular scenery.

**Payment Schedule:**

A deposit of \$500 per person is due with reservation. Final payment is due 100 days prior (May 28, 2027) to departure date. Invoice will be sent out prior to final payment. Passengers September add after this date subject to air and land availability. Generally airlines do not increase the price of a ticket after it has been contracted. However, prior to the issuance of a ticket, airlines may (and regularly do) impose fuel, tax, or security surcharges. In the event a surcharge is imposed after Ed-Ventures has received a final payment, Ed-Ventures will send an additional invoice for the surcharge amount. Early registration is encouraged.

**Currency:**

Currency exchange rates fluctuate constantly. In the event of a significant drop in the value of the dollar, we reserve the right to add a currency surcharge to the price of the tour.

**Refund/Cancellation Policy:**

All cancellations must be in writing. The date of postmark will determine the amount of refund due. Refunds are based on the number of days prior to departure date. From the time of deposit to 99 days before departure a \$100 administrative fee plus any airfare penalties will be assessed. From Final payment due date until 46 days before departure, a \$500 cancellation penalty plus lost airfare deposits and any unrecoverable deposits to ground suppliers will be assessed. Airline tickets once purchased are nonrefundable. Anyone canceling 45 days or less prior to departure will receive **no refund**.
