What is the Home & School Association and S.A.L.T.?

Home & School Association and S.A.L.T. (St. Anthony Leadership Team) is the major support organization for St. Anthony of Padua Catholic School. It is S.A.L.T.'s responsibility to coordinate the many volunteer committees and to provide support to the school staff, students, and you - the parents!

Home & School/S.A.L.T. consists of an Executive Committee: President; Vice-President/Fundraising Co-Chair; Secretary; Treasurer; Principal; a committee member from each Class (*Lead Room Parent*), and *Marketing Coordinator*(s). Home & School/S.A.L.T. meets monthly during the school year. *Any parent is welcome to attend the Home & School meetings*. *These are OPEN Meetings*.

- **S.A.L.T. COORDINATES**: we <u>coordinate</u> about 12-15 volunteer committees throughout the year, including Room Parents, Hospitality, BoxTops and Label collection, special community events, and more.
- **S.A.L.T. SPONSORS:** we <u>sponsor</u> the Parent Ambassador program, Family Events, and other community events, Catholic Schools Week activities, school assemblies, other fundraising programs like the Wildcat Walk and Restaurant Nights.
- **S.A.L.T. PROVIDES:** we <u>provide</u> funds to support teachers with their classroom needs, seasonal gifts to support staff, \$25 to each Lead Room Parent for help with parties, \$10 per student toward field trip costs, treats for students/families on special days (Walk-A-Thon, Field Day, 8th Grade Reception, Awards night), and rose bushes to 8th grade families with their last child leaving St. Anthony.
- **S.A.L.T. SUPPORTS:** we <u>support</u> student organizations with a monetary donation (Drama Club, Odyssey of the Mind, Science Olympiad, etc..). We support our teachers, students, parents and school staff, and library, throughout the year.
- **S.A.L.T. COMMUNICATES:** we <u>communicate</u> upcoming events and information in the weekly newsletter, calendar, **Facebook (St Anthony of Padua Home & School Association/SALT) like us!**, and the St. Anthony website (**www.saparish.com**); we also communicate volunteer opportunities within St. Anthony.
- **S.A.L.T. SERVES:** we <u>serve</u> the needs of the school community by forming a strong and effective partnership between HOME and SCHOOL!

Home & School Association and S.A.L.T. Volunteer Opportunities

I. LEADERSHIP ROLES

Lead Room Parent and S.A.L.T. Representative

(One per classroom) (Two per grade-level if applicable)

The Lead Room Parent works with the teacher in planning and coordinating holiday parties and other special events related to grade-level. She communicates with classroom parents via letter, email or phone calls, collecting donations for class parties, teacher gifts, and other events, as needed. She works with the Classroom Parent Team, and others who volunteer, with the Outreach Ministry. The Lead Room Parent maintains a Room Parent Folder for that classroom, ensuring a continuity of classroom events with teachers, and a 'baton' to pass on to next year's Lead. She attends an initial Room Parent meeting in September, and an end of year Room Parent meeting in May or June. A Lead Room Parent is automatically a S.A.L.T. Representative and is encouraged to attend at least three (3) S.A.L.T. meetings throughout the school year, (held monthly, usually early evening). At those meetings, he/she will vote on matters pertinent to Home & School, participate in event planning, budget decisions and feedback sessions, and vote on the Executive Committee positions for following school year.

Marketing Team Member

This position will focus on "getting the word out" about upcoming events. They set up monthly Restaurant Fundraiser Nights. They attend the monthly meetings and address the marketing needs. This team may submit Home & School-related newsletter entries and/or attachments, create bulletin board postings and signage for events. They work with Parent Ambassadors to keep new families informed, including information tables at Welcome Meeting, Open House, and Winter Conferences. The team helps us be successful with Home & School endeavors through promotion and communication.

Assemblies Team Leader

This person will research and collect information on speakers/ topics/programs for potential school assemblies. She/He will present options at S.A.L.T. meetings and then proceed with necessary scheduling and organizing. Goal is for two-four special student assemblies per year, depending on cost/budget.

Box Tops Team Leader

Oversee the collection, trimming and counting of Box Tops and Labels for Education. Usually there is a pool of helpers that you will organize and mobilize to make the submission deadline dates. Box Tops monies represent approximately 20-25% of the H&S Budget. Labels for Education is a redemption program that provides purchasing power from the LFE Catalog of educational merchandise. Critical submission deadlines are Nov. 1 and Mar 1.

II. Volunteer IN THE CLASSROOM

Classroom Auction Project Team Leader

TWO volunteers, <u>per grade</u>, coordinate a classroom project that is offered for sale at the Auction. Auction will take place in November 2017. The *Classroom Auction Project Coordinator* communicates with the *Auction Committee Chairperson* prior to the start of your project to get some general direction on the auction theme. You work with teachers and students on a one-of-a-kind class project, and collect donations, (money or items) to fit your theme. The project needs to have a written description for the Auction Catalog prior to press time, and be completed for preview a few weeks before Auction. If needed, you can call upon your *Lead Room Parent*, and the *Classroom Parent Team* for any assistance.

Classroom Parent Team

Two or more parents <u>per classroom</u> are needed to act as a 'helping pool' throughout the year. The team helps the *Lead Room Parent* at holiday parties and other special events. They help the *Auction Basket/Project Team Leader* on the class project, and they help with the *Outreach Ministry*, if needed. The *Lead Room Parent* will touch base with you by October 1st. You may be called upon for other class-specific needs, i.e. field trips, Catholic Schools Week fun days, and special events.

III. Volunteer for HOSPITALITY

Hospitality Team Leader: This volunteer coordinates the hospitality for main-event receptions, such as the Christmas Program, Catholic Schools Week VIP reception, teacher conference meals, etc. She procures refreshments via school-wide jean day donations, newsletter, or phone calls. She arranges set-up teams, serving teams and clean up teams using the *Hospitality Pool* (see 8. below) and middle school students, as permitted.

Hospitality Pool. Help at events (mentioned above), with set-up, serving, or clean-up. Make/Provide food for events.

Parent Ambassadors for New Families (Mentors). Meet new families in August at New Family Welcome, mentor families throughout the school year, answering questions, guiding through Scrip, volunteering, Catholic Schools Week, fundraising events, etc. Training will be provided.
