Red Mountain Ranch Landscape Update September 2024



Our Work in Your Community

- Your DLC crew has carefully maintained your Community's landscape through the summer, and now they are preparing for the arrival of cooler temperatures.
- Our team has worked with Community Management and the Board to select turf areas to oversee this year, and we begin lowering mower deck heights by 1/4 inch per week until it's time to overseed. Normally, the Bermuda grass will become blonde and straw-like during this process.
- For all turf areas, plants, and trees, our Water Department and Specially-trained Irrigators monitor rainfall and on-the-ground conditions to deliver the right amount of water for your landscape.
- Our crew addresses any remaining broken tree branches after monsoon storms. They continue lifting tree canopies and trimming suckers as they work through the Community.
- In addition, they routinely prune shrubs off of sidewalks and below walls and fences.
- Our Specialized Arbor crew is finishing pruning trees above contract height.
- A Community-wide application of pre-emergent is complete to help minimize weeds popping up in the future.

Landscaping Tips

If you are looking to add some new plants to your yard, fall is a great time to do so! With the arrival of cooler temperatures, plants can withstand transfer better and require slightly less water. Before planting, be sure to till the soil and add fertilizer if needed.

Keep these tips in mind when planting:

- Check your irrigation system for any hard water deposits that may have built up along your drip lines. If found, be sure to clear your drip lines thoroughly before planting any new plants.
- Consider the limitations of your space when choosing a new plant or tree. How big will it be once it has fully matured? How much water does it require? How much light?

Please note that if you buy any species that flowers in warm weather, it will soon lose its blossoms as we move into winter. That's okay, though, as it should bloom again next year.
