

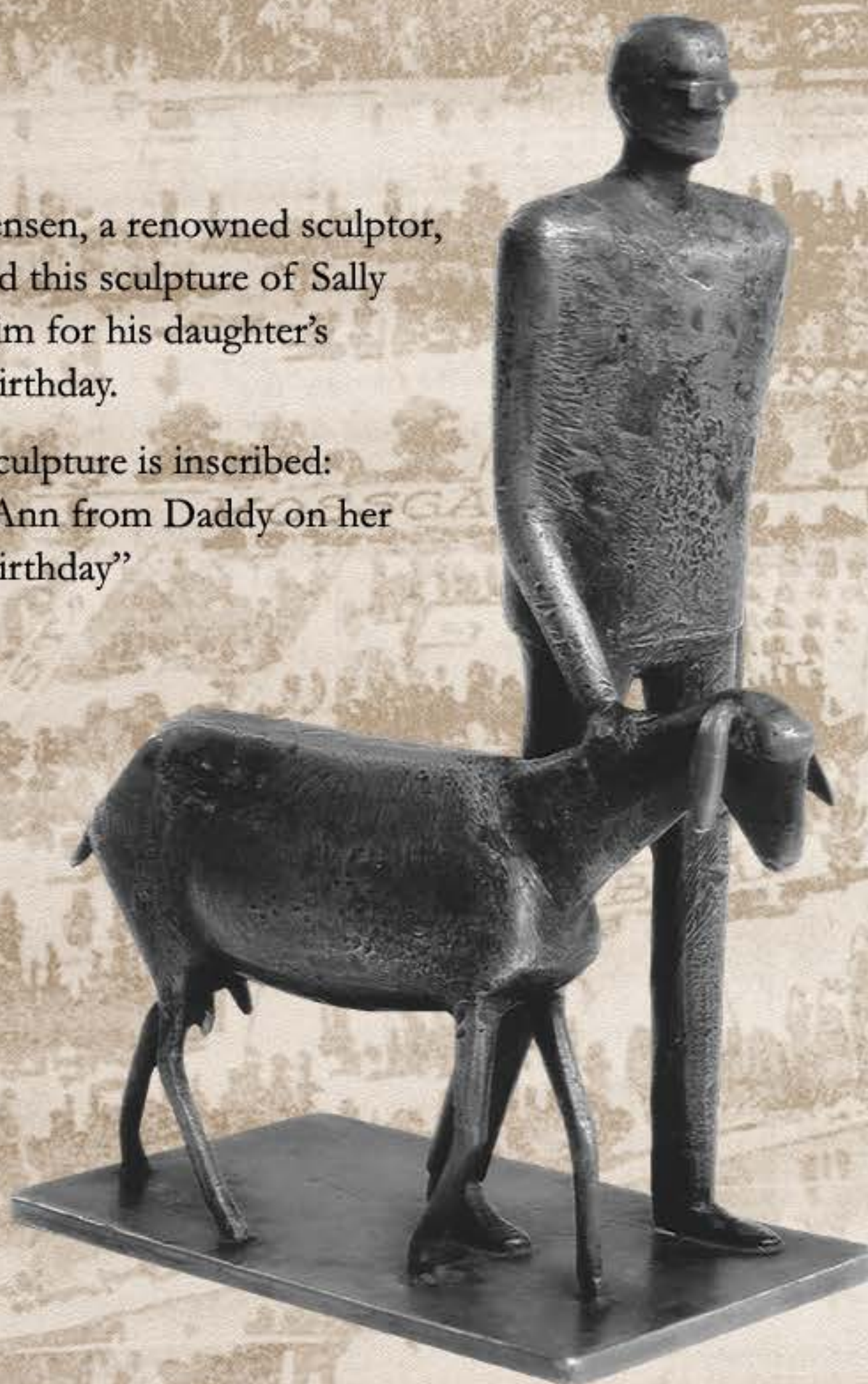
YARROW POINT

SALLY'S ALLEY

Platted to be a street, Sally's Alley was never paved and serves as a public walking/biking path between 94th and 95th Avenues. It is named after Sally, a goat, who grazed there and was owned by Ray and Gloria Jensen.

Ray Jensen, a renowned sculptor, created this sculpture of Sally and him for his daughter's first birthday.

The sculpture is inscribed:
"For Ann from Daddy on her first birthday"



In 1960 when his daughter Ann was born with an intolerance to cow's milk, Ray Jensen acquired a Nubian milk goat he named Sally. Ray taught himself to milk the goat to provide milk for Ann.

"We had let Sally roam within our fenced yard until we found out she ate things we didn't want her to. One time she escaped and we found her over at the Tremper's, who lived on 37th, eating their geraniums on their front porch. So I would tether Sally in the area that has become known as Sally's Alley."
