Southern California Public Radio, home to KPCC (89.3 FM) and LAist.com, recently led a photography project focused on parents. In Year 2 of the project, we want to center the experiences of those who care for kids across Southern California.

The importance of caregiving is front and center as the COVID-19 pandemic has left many scrambling to care for their kids without their usual support systems. Many family, friends, and neighbors have stepped up to take care of kids so parents could work. Caregivers and providers have had to take on extra responsibilities to keep families safe and stretch their resources to keep their doors open. We want to know:  
**What is important to know about your experience as a caregiver or educator?**  
**What is missing from the public conversation about early childhood?**
