SEXUAL ASSAULT CENTER & DOMESTIC VIOLENCE PROGRAM

Services to youth and adult survivors of sexual assault, domestic violence or dating violence:

- 24-hour confidential hotlines
- Information and referrals
- Personal advocates who can respond to the school to meet with the survivors of sexual, domestic or dating violence
- Emotional support and safety services
- Medical, law enforcement, and court accompaniment
- Community education and outreach
- Individual therapy for primary and secondary survivors of sexual assault
- Psychoeducational and support groups
- Emergency shelter
- Prevention services
- Cyber abuse related to dating abuse
- Protection orders

Resources, support, training and technical assistance: Topics include adolescent reproductive health and pregnancy prevention, puberty, parent-child communication, working with LGBTQ youth and positive youth development.

Keep It 360: A weekly after-school club at TC Williams to facilitate open and honest conversations about issues that impact youth and work on youth-led events and initiatives.

Youth Peer Educators: Provide workshops on adolescent sexual health issues.

SUBSTANCE ABUSE PREVENTION COALITION OF ALEXANDRIA

Facts and Consequences About Substance Use Presentations: Seminars challenging youth to think more about their own and their friends' behaviors regarding alcohol and other drugs.

Healthy Conversations Dinners: Interactive workshop featuring an evening of guided conversations with parents and their teens about healthy decision-making and avoiding risky behaviors. Dinner, childcare and interpretation are provided. Presented by ACPS Family and Community Engagement Center, Stop Child Abuse Now, ACAP and SAPCA.

Titan Takeover: A quarterly event open to Alexandria teens that includes dinner, games, a DJ, a photo booth and gift card raffles throughout the night.

Youth Leadership Conference: Free three-day event to build and enhance leadership skills among rising 9th – 12th graders and connect them with opportunities to become more civically engaged in the Alexandria community. Hosted by SAPCA and ACAP.
