Local landlord advocacy groups <u>In It Together</u>, <u>East Bay Rental Housing Association</u> (EBRHA), and the <u>Business and Housing Network</u> all helped organize and attended the protest as well. They were joined by former City Councilmember Loren Taylor who gave up his District 6 seat to run for mayor last year.

"This sent me to the hospital for stress," said John Williams, a West Oakland duplex owner who said his long-term tenant stopped paying the monthly \$1,500 rent at the beginning of the pandemic, putting him at risk of foreclosure. Williams is a plaintiff in an <a href="mailto:ongoing landlord">ongoing landlord</a> lawsuit against Oakland and Alameda County. At a <a href="mailto:court hearing last year">court hearing last year</a>, he said he'd faced housing discrimination as a Black renter and bought the building to ensure he'd have stability as well as rental income.
