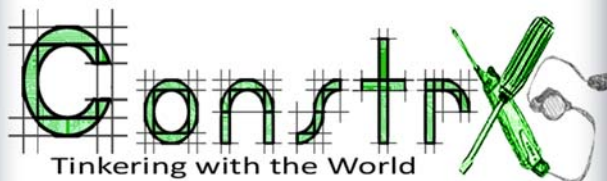
**Scholarships are available for students who qualify for free and reduced lunch and are enrolled in a public school in the Crawford, Erie or Warren County.**
