

## UsAgainstAlzheimer's 2021 Fall Internship Description

UsAgainstAlzheimer's (UsA2) is currently seeking a motivated advanced undergraduate student, graduate student, or recent graduate for a Fall 2021 intern (approx. Sept – Dec 2021).

Founded in 2010 to stop Alzheimer's disease, [UsA2](#) was formed by a group of people impacted by the disease determined to change the sluggish "business as usual" mindset of that time and to instill greater urgency, innovation, and collaboration in the battle to end Alzheimer's. UsAgainstAlzheimer's exists to conquer Alzheimer's disease. We take on the toughest problems; bring all of "Us" together to break down barriers; advocate for research that will speed treatments to market; and drive changes that matter most to people living with the disease. We will not rest until brain-span equals lifespan - for everyone.

The intern will report to the Project Director of Brain Health Partnerships and will have the opportunity to work and gain knowledge on a range of Alzheimer's and healthy aging policy-related issues, develop workplace skills, and receive general professional development and mentorship opportunities. The intern will help with data collection, policy research, literature reviews, drafting communications materials (such as social media posts and blog entries), and assist in the planning and promotion of webinars and other events. The intern may also attend briefings, hearings, and meetings, as needed.

### Requirements

Candidates should be students or recent graduates in public health, public policy, political science, communications, or a related field. Excellent research, writing, and organizational skills are required, as well as the ability to work independently within a team environment. Demonstrated interest in public health and policy preferred.

Candidates should be available to work approximately 20-30 hours per week during standard Eastern-time business hours, September through December, however UsA2 recognizes that interns may be enrolled in school and can be flexible for the right candidate.

The position will be fully remote so interns should have access to a computer and reliable internet.

The internship includes a stipend.
