**Research Coordinator Positions (Job Opening ID: 523943):**

Responsibilities would involve assisting with project coordination, conducting clinical assessments, and providing project-related interventions. Ideal candidates include individuals who have completed a master's degree in mental health counseling, clinical social work, or comparable training and who have experience providing clinical services to children with ADHD and their families. Experience providing behavioral consultation to teachers in elementary school settings is preferred. The ability to provide services in Spanish and English is required. Candidates in their final year of a relevant clinical master's program will be considered. Opportunities will be available for the successful candidate(s) to receive supervised clinical experience towards licensure. This role will involve traveling to participating schools within Miami-Dade County.

**Research Assistant Positions (Job Opening ID: 523942):**

Responsibilities would involve assisting with project recruitment, conducting initial eligibility screenings, scheduling study appointments, conducting classroom observations, and assisting with data collection. Ideal candidates include individuals with a bachelor's degree in psychology or a related field. Research experience and experience working with children with ADHD and their families is preferred. The ability to converse fluently in both English and Spanish is required. This role will involve traveling to participating schools within Miami-Dade County.
