Grand Avenue natural gas main replacement project

Dear Puget Sound Energy customer and neighbor,

In an ongoing effort to deliver safe and reliable energy to our Everett-area customers, PSE and IFS crews will be working on the natural gas system in your neighborhood. The work entails replacing the existing, decades old underground natural gas main and replacing select services to homes. We are committed to completing our work safely and efficiently, and our crews will do their best to reduce impacts to nearby neighbors. Please see below for project details.

Work details

Who: Natural gas crews from PSE and InfraSource
What: Replacing the underground natural gas main
When: Work is expected to begin in early August and is

anticipated to last approximately four (4) months
Typical work hours are Monday – Friday, 8 a.m. – 5 p.m.

Where: Grand Avenue between Ninth Street and 15th Street,

Everett (please refer to map on reverse)

What you can expect

- To prepare for this work, crews will be in the neighborhood to mark the current underground utilities with brightly colored paint or flags.
- Signs and traffic control flaggers will guide vehicles and pedestrians safely through the work zone. We will work
 to maintain access to driveways/parking whenever possible, in coordination with impacted neighbors as
 needed.
- There will likely be noise from trucks and heavy machinery during work hours.
- As part of this work, natural gas customers will have the gas service line to their home replaced, requiring a brief interruption of service. Our crew foreman will provide those affected customers with more information in advance of the service line work occurring on their property.
- To minimize impacts to the sidewalk, roadway and/or nearby vegetation, we use a boring machine to install the pipe horizontally under the roadway versus a more invasive open trenching method whenever possible.
- After the gas main construction is complete, you will notice temporary patches in the road and/or sidewalk.
 These temporary patches will remain until a contractor crew from AA Asphalting, Inc. returns to complete the final road and/or sidewalk restoration. The restoration schedule is dependent upon weather, permitting and crew availability.

Sewer safety

If our project involves being underground near your sewer or septic lines, we will conduct a follow-up inspection of your lines by inserting a camera through them. Although our installers take care to avoid sewer and septic lines, on rare occasions, a gas pipeline is inadvertently installed through those lines, which are often not mapped or detectable using above-ground sensors.
