The Oregon Student Mock Election (OSME) is an experience-based civics education program that immerses students in the electoral process and demonstrates the importance of voting. Students will vote using an abbreviated version of the Oregon ballot that is created just for them. All Oregon students in grades 6-12 are eligible to participate.

Realistic Voting Experience for Students

- Realistic mock ballots are customized for several voting jurisdictions
- Students have the same kind of voting experience as all Oregon voters
- Detailed lessons explain the voting process
- Students experience researching the candidates and ballot measures on their ballot

If you vote for more candidates than allowed for an office or if you vote both Yes and No on a measure, it is called an overvote and your vote will not count for that contest.

If you make a mistake or change your mind while marking your ballot,

- You may correct it yourself. See example below.
- Make your choice obvious so that your intent is understood and your vote is counted correctly.
