

A BRIEF HISTORY ABOUT THE

VENUE: ST. MARK'S WAS FOUNDED IN 1867 AT THE SEWALL - BELMONT HOUSE, ONE OF THE OLDEST CHURCHES IN WASHINGTON DC DESIGNED BY T. BUCKLER GHEQUIER, A BALTIMORE ARCHITECT, THE BUILDING IS IN A LATE VICTORIAN NEO-GOTHIC STYLE THAT REFLECTS THE NEO-ROMANESQUE STYLE POPULAR AT THAT TIME. IT IS FILLED WITH STAINED GLASS CREATED BY TWO OF THE FINEST DESIGNERS OF THIS CRAFT: MAYER OF MUNICH AND J&R LAMB OF NEW YORK, THE BAPTISTERY IS DOMINATED BY THE LARGE TIFFANY WINDOW, THE ONLY

TIFFANY IN WASHINGTON, DC, STILL

IN ITS ORIGINAL LOCATION.

SONET PIANO DUO ARMINE GRIGORYAN - SONA BARSEGHYAN WAS FOUNDED IN 2003. WITHIN THE SAME YEAR THE DUO PARTICIPATED IN THE ROME INTERNATIONAL COMPETITION ORGANIZED BY F. CHOPIN ASSOCIATION AND BECAME THE LAUREATES AND ALSO WAS AWARDED A SPECIAL PRIZE FOR THE BEST PERFORMANCE OF THE CONTEMPORARY ITALIAN COMPOSER SERGIO CALLIGARIS.

THE DUO APPEARS FREQUENTLY IN CONCERTS BOTH AT HOME AND ON TOURS ABROAD: USA, CANADA, AUSTRALIA, RUSSIA, GERMANY, BELGIUM, ITALY, ETC., IN SUCH CONCERT HALLS AS INDEPENDENT THEATER (SYDNEY), MAZZOLINI HALL (TORONTO), MOSCOW CONSERVATORY HALL, ETC.

THE REPERTOIRE IS RICH, EMBRACING COMPOSITIONS OF VARIOUS GENRES: FROM PIECES FOR FOUR HANDS TO DOUBLE CONCERTOS WITH ORCHESTRA (BACH, MOZART, POULENC).
