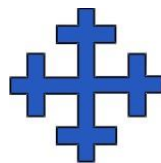

## The First Reading

Acts 16:9-15

During the night Paul had a vision: there stood a man of Macedonia pleading with him and saying, "Come over to Macedonia and help us." When he had seen the vision, we immediately tried to cross over to Macedonia, being convinced that God had called us to proclaim the good news to them. We set sail from Troas and took a straight course to Samothrace, the following day to Neapolis, and from there to Philippi, which is a leading city of the district of Macedonia and a Roman colony. We remained in this city for some days. On the sabbath day we went outside the gate by the river, where we supposed there was a place of prayer; and we sat down and spoke to the women who had gathered there. A certain woman named Lydia, a worshiper of God, was listening to us; she was from the city of Thyatira and a dealer in purple cloth. The Lord opened her heart to listen eagerly to what was said by Paul. When she and her household were baptized, she urged us, saying, "If you have judged me to be faithful to the Lord, come and stay at my home." And she prevailed upon us.

In the spirit the angel carried me away to a great, high mountain and showed me the holy city Jerusalem coming down out of heaven from God. I saw no temple in the city, for its temple is the Lord God the Almighty and the Lamb. And the city has no need of sun or moon to shine on it, for the glory of God is its light, and its lamp is the Lamb. The nations will walk by its light, and the kings of the earth will bring their glory into it. Its gates will never be shut by day-- and there will be no night there. People will bring into it the glory and the honor of the nations. But nothing unclean will enter it, nor anyone who practices abomination or falsehood, but only those who are written in the Lamb's book of life. Then the angel showed me the river of the water of life, bright as crystal, flowing from the throne of God and of the Lamb through the middle of the street of the city. On either side of the river is the tree of life with its twelve kinds of fruit, producing its fruit each month; and the leaves of the tree are for the healing of the nations. Nothing accursed will be found there any more. But the throne of God and of the Lamb will be in it, and his servants will worship him; they will see his face, and his name will be on their foreheads. And there will be no more night; they need no light of lamp or sun, for the Lord God will be their light, and they will reign forever and ever.

## Thoughts in Transition

### *from the Interim Rector*

From time to time, I will be writing to you with some reflections during this time of transition. I hope you will find them helpful.

St. Mary of the Harbor is in a time of significant transition. Your former rector has retired, and what was familiar has given way to a time where things are unfamiliar and in flux. All of us have had such times of transition in our personal lives, as we moved from one chapter of life into another. And we can remember the mix of feelings we had at such times: excitement, trepidation, wonder, and hope.

One of my goals as your Interim Rector is to help you bear whatever feelings you are having as we travel through this threshold time together. I can think of no better aids in this time than the three theological virtues St. Paul so eloquently spoke of in the thirteenth chapter of his First Letter to the Church – a parish really – in Corinth. They too were in a time of significant transitions, for after a time of growing the parish, Paul had moved on, and they were not sure how to manage things now that he has gone. So, Paul reminds them that they have three gifts that can buoy them up, and act as sources of strength as they face into the future. Those gifts are **faith, hope, and love**. And each gift has, if you will, a different time signature.

**FAITH** ~ Faith's time signature is the past. Faith has to do with remembering all the many past acts of grace and goodness that God has poured out on St. Mary's over the years. Remembering those good things with thanks builds up faith. For faith is, in essence, trust in God. Remembering God's past goodness and grace can remind you that God loves St. Mary's so well – as Jesus says in John's Gospel (John 14:18) – that you have never have been, and never will be, left comfortless, never left without God's strength.

**HOPE** ~ Hope's time signature is the future. "Hope is the imagination of things not yet seen." (Hebrews 11:1) So hope galvanizes your powers of imagination to picture the parish you want – and hope – St. Mary's will be in the years to come. Be specific in your hopes, as you pray them out to God, and share them with one another. Hope is a powerful dynamo of energy, and can remind you that just as God never left you in the past, God also will be with you in the exciting new possible futures you are imagining for St. Mary of the Harbor.

**LOVE** ~ Love's time signature is the present. And St. Paul is clear that the greatest gift we have in times of transition is love. Love turns us away from worry about the future and nostalgia for the past. Love grounds us in the present moment, for to be alive in this moment is a gift: to have the opportunity to show love right now by expressing care for one another, and providing whatever help you can for the parish as a family. I have already experienced the palpable love that shines out of you here at St. Mary's. There is no better way to live in the present, and to prepare to welcome your new rector, than to keep loving one another with all the grace and gusto you have. Nothing will be more of a beacon attracting new parishioners – and the best possible candidates for rector – than their seeing how much you love one another and this parish.
